Saturday August 24th 1899 First Part Light Breezes from the north to West and thick weather steering to the southward at 6 AM took in sail heading S S E Middle Part the same Latter Part brisk Breezes from the N W and Pleasant weather steering S S W Parted the fore top sail the made all sail saw Whales and Porpoises Lat 34.25 South Long 85.35 West

Remarks Onboard

Sunday August 25th First Part Brisk Breezes from the N W and Pleasant weather steering S S W saw Porpoises at 6 AM took in all sail but the Under Mast Reef Main top sail and stay sails heading S W Middle and Latter Part strong Breezes from the Northward heading to the Westward Under Mast Reef Main top sail and stay sails thick Rainy weather Lat South Long West

Remarks Onboard

Monday August 26th First Part strong Breezes from the south heading heading to the Westward Under Mast Reef Main top sail and stay sails thick Rainy weather at 6 AM heaved ship to the Eastward Middle and Latter Part the same at 10 AM spoke the Barque Thames from the Pacific Ocean with 1100 tons Oil Bound to London Lat South Long West

Tuesday August 27th First Part strong Breezes from the south with thick Rainy weather heading to the Westward at 6 AM heaved ship to the N W Under main top sail and stay sails heading S S W Middle Part the same Latter Part strong Breezes from the Southward heaved ship to the E S E and made sail Employed in ships Duty Lat 34.49 South Long 85.28 West

Remarks Onboard

Wednesday August 28th First Part strong Breezes from the N W steering to the S E Under Double Reef top sails and main sail left and Spanker Employed in ships Duty at 6 AM took in sail but the Under Mast Reef Main top sail Middle Part the same Latter Part Light Breezes from the Eastward made sail steered to the south Lat 34.48 South

Baltimore On a Whaling Voyage in the South Atlantic

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Thursday August 29th 1899 First Part Light Breezes from the Eastward steering to the S E Under Double Reef top sails and main sail left and Spanker saw Fin Back at 6 AM took in sail but the Under Mast Reef Main top sail and stay sails heading S S E Middle and Latter Part strong Gale from the N W heading East thick Rainy weather Lat South Long West

Remarks Onboard

Friday August 30th First Part the Gale veered to the Westward heading North took in the main top sail Middle Part the same Latter Part Moderate Breezes from the N W with Rain set the main top sail and fore sail started a leak of water Employed in ships Duty Lat 34.52 South

Remarks Onboard

Saturday August 31st First Part Moderate Breezes from the N W with some Rain steering S S E saw Fin Backs and Porpoises at 6 AM took in the fore sail and luffed to the wind to the S E Middle and Latter Part strong Gale from the Westward with heavy squalls of Rain took in the main top sail saw a ship steering to the S S E Thunder Lightning and Hale on Rain and Wind Lat 34.49 South

Sunday September 1st First Part Heavy Gale from the Westward with squalls of Rain heading to the N W Under the stay sails Middle and Latter Part the same heading to the southward Under the stay sails Lat 34.08 South

Remarks Onboard

Monday Sept 2nd First strong Gale from the N W steering to the Northward Under the stay sails Middle and Latter Part more Moderate set the fore sail and main top sail at 10 AM took in the fore sail thick Rainy weather Lat South

Remarks Onboard

Tuesday Sept 3rd First Part strong Gale from the N W with thick Rainy weather took in the main top sail heading N E Middle and Latter Part same Lat 33.36 South Long West
