Saturday October 5th 1899 Remarks Onboard

First Part Breeze from the Northward and Pleasant Weather made all sail and steered to the N. E. by the Wind Saw Fin Backs back to the S. W. at Sun Set back to the N. E. and took in sail Middle and Latter Part Strong Breeze from the Southward with some Rain at Day Light made sail and steered to the N. W. Lat 34.42 South Long 24.27 West

Sunday Oct 6th Remarks Onboard

First Part Light Breeze from the Southward and Pleasant Weather Steering to the S. W. Under all sail at 6 P.M. saw a Sail to the S. W. at 8 P.M. took in sail for the night Steering S. W. Middle Part Calm Weather Latter Part Light Breeze from the Northward and Pleasant Weather at Day Light made all sail and steered to the S. W. the Above mentioned Ship in Sight Saw Fin Backs and Hump Backs Lat 34.40 South Long West

Monday Oct 7th Remarks Onboard

First Part Light Breeze from the S. W. at 1 P.M. took in sail to the N. W. at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Elizabeth John and Elizabeth of New London 15 m. Out with 600 tds of Whale and 300 tds of Spermaceti Middle and Latter Part Moderate Breeze from the S. E. and Pleasant Weather Steering to the N. W. in Company with the Above mentioned Ship Saw Fin Backs Lat 34.35 South

Tuesday Oct 8th Remarks Onboard

First Part Breeze from the S. E. and Pleasant Weather Steering to the N. W. in Company with the Above mentioned Ship at Sun Set Luffed to the Wind to the Southward and took in sail Middle Part Moderate Breeze from the Northward and Thick Weather at Day Light made sail and steered to the S. W. started a Cask of Water Saw Fin Backs the Above mentioned Ship in Sight Lat 34.54 South Long 25.18 West

Wednesday Oct 9th Remarks Onboard

First Part Breeze from the Southward and Pleasant Weather Steering S. W. the Above mentioned Ship in Sight at 6 P.M. took in sail and luffed to the N. W. Middle Part the same Latter Part Breeze from the South and Thick Weather made all sail and steered to the S. W. saw a French Schooner Steering to the S. E. Lat 35.13 South Long 26.31 West

Friday Oct 11th Remarks Onboard

First Part Strong Gale from the Northward and Rainy Weather to the S. W. at 4 P.M. the Wind shifted to S. W. took in sail to the S. W. the Above mentioned Ship in Sight Saw Fin Backs Middle and Latter Part Light Breeze from the S. W. and Pleasant Weather at Day Light made sail and to the N. E. saw Fin Backs Employed Jolly Reef and Tack Lat 35.41 South Long 28.22 West

Saturday Oct 12th Remarks Onboard

First Part Light Breeze and Calm Weather Steering to the Westward the John and Elizabeth in Sight at Sun Set took in sail for the night Middle Part Light Breeze from the West Steering to the Northward Latter Part Strong Breeze from the Westward at Day Light made sail and steered to the N. E. at 11 A.M. took the Wind from the Northward Blowed Strong with Rain took in the main sail Jib and Tinker and fore top sail and double reefed the main top sail took in the Westward Lat 35.16 South

Sunday Oct 13th Remarks Onboard

First Part took the Wind from the S. W. took in sail to the N. W. took in the fore sail and Elost Reefed the main top sail Middle and Latter Part Strong Gale from the Southward at Day Light high made sail and steered to the Westward Lat 34.59 South

Monday Oct 14th Remarks Onboard

First Part Moderate Breeze from the Southward Steering to the Westward at 6 P.M. took in sail Steering West Middle and Latter Part Moderate Breeze from the Southward and Pleasant Weather at Day Light made sail and steered to the Westward Employed at Ships Tack Lat 34.59 South Long by Lunar 29.52 by Clock 29.92
