Monday November 5th 1899

First Part Moderate Breeze from the Westward
N. Wind, thick Rainy Weather at 1 P.M. took in the Main Gail 15th and
Span to and haul 1st sail and Double Reefed the Main 1st Gail at 6 P.M.
took in the Fore Sail and 1st reefed the Main 1st Gail heading East
Middle and Latter Part thick Rainy Weather Lat. 34.57 Long 24.55 West

Tuesday November 6th

First Part Strong Gale from the Westward and
thick Rainy Weather heading to the Eastward Under 1st Reef Main
1st Gail and 1st Gails Middle Part the same Latter Part light Breeze
from the S.W. and Pleasant weather at Day Light Made Sail and Steered to the
Westward Lowered the Mast and Chased Pump Backs at 3.45 Long 24.55 West

Wednesday November 7th

First Part Light Breeze from the S.W. and Pleasant weather
Steering to the S.W. Under all Gail Employed at Ship's Duty at Sun Set took in
Gail and Luffed to the S.W. Middle and Latter Part calm Weather at Day Light
Made Sail Employed at Ship's Duty at Meridian saw a sperm Whale
5 miles off all Hands Got Dinner and Got Ready for Lanching 3.30

Thursday November 8th

First Part calm weather at 1 P.M. Lowered for the Whale
5 miles off calm weather Pulled about 6 miles and Stopped here. 2 Hours
saw no Whale came to the ship at 3 P.M. saw the Whale 3 miles off
put off and Chased at Sun Set came Onboard and took in Gail light
Breeze from the S.W. heading to the Westward Middle and Latter Part calm
weather Employed at Ship's Duty started a bar of Water Lat 35.40 Long 24.39 West

Friday November 9th

First Part Light Breeze from the Westward and
Pleasant weather at 5 P.M. spoke the Barque of Greenport 4 miles out
to Sea at Sun Set took in Gail heading East Middle Part the same
Latter Part Light Breeze from the Westward Made Sail and Lashed Ship to
the Westward at Meridian saw a sperm Whale Got Ready to lower
and all Hands went to Dinner Lat 35.57 Long 24.02 6.40 24.5

Sunday November 10th 1899

First Part Light Breeze from the Westward
at 1 P.M. Lowered the Mast and Chased that Right Whale mentioned in
the last days work at 3 P.M. came Onboard and Steered to the Westward saw
fin Backs at Sun Set took in Gail to the right heading to the Westward
Middle and Latter Part Strong Gale from the Westward and Rainy weather
heading to the Westward Lat 34.57 Long 24.55 West

Monday November 11th

First Part calm thick Rainy weather Middle and
Latter Part calm Pleasant weather at Day Light Made Sail Employed at Ship's Duty
saw fin Backs and Dolphins Lat 35.45 South Long 24.19 West by chron 24.37 West

Tuesday November 12th

First Part Moderate Breeze from the S.W. and Pleasant weather
Steering to the Westward Under all Gail saw a plenty of fin Backs at 1 P.M. took in
Gail heading to the S.W. Middle Part calm weather Latter Part Moderate Breeze from
the Southward and Pleasant at Day Light Made all Gail saw a Barque Steering to the S.W.
at 3 P.M. saw a sperm Whale Lowered the Mast and One Boat put out to
the Whale 3 miles to the Westward of the ship put the line and came Onboard
steered to the S.W. Lat 36.12 South Long 25.16 West

Wednesday November 13th

First Part Strong Breeze from the Southward Steering to
the S.W. Under all Gail secured the Manks and 1st reef it at Sun Set
took in Gail to the right heading to the S.W. Middle Part Strong Breeze from
the S.W. heading South Latter Part Strong Breeze from the Eastward and
thick weather at Day Light 1st Single Reef 1st Gail Steering to the South
at 1 P.M. took in the Fore 1st Gail and Double Reefed the Main 1st Gail Rainy

Thursday November 14th

First Part Strong Gale from the Eastward and thick
Rainy weather at 6 P.M. reefed 1st to the S.W. and took in the Fore
Sail and 1st reefed the Main 1st Gail 1st Gail weather Middle and
Latter Part the same Made Sail Steered to the Westward saw Dolphins
Lat 36.05 South Long 25.50 West
