Oct. saw a sperm Wholly Landed the Boats saw him home at 11 P. M. same Onboard Lat 35.51 South Long 23.34 West

Thursday Nov 21

First Part Breeze from the S. W. and Pleasant weather steering to the S. W. two ships in sight and a plenty of Fin Backs at 7 P. M. took in Gail for the night steering S. W. Middle Part the same latter Part Strong Breezes North made Gail Steered to the Northward saw Fin Backs at 10 P. M. veered ship to the S. W. Lat 35.09 South Long 23.53 West

W. saw Right Whales at Sun got lost. Did not lower Middle and latter Part Moderate Breezes from the S. E. at Day Light made Gail and Steered from West to South lowered the Boats and chased Fin Backs Lat 35.45 South Long 24.42 West
