Saw more Whales Lowered and Hoisted at Meridian Came Onboard
Heard several Courses Lat 35. 30 South Long 26. 50 West 26. 50 West

Tuesday Dec 9

Monday Dec 3
First Part Brisk Breeze from the Westward and Pleasant Weather Steering several courses Saw eight Whales lowered and chased. Got nothing. Plenty of Whales going quick at 6 P.M. Wind veered to the Northward took in sail. Heading to the Westward middle and latter part light. Breeze from the S.W. and Pleasant Weather Steering several courses Employed making a fore stay Sat 35. 29 S. Long 26. 49

Wednesday Dec. 4

Just Past Light Ship from the 2nd Steering to the N.W.
Saw Right Whales Lower and Shaved & Hairs at Sun Set. Same Onboard and
Back in. Just Steading to South. Noddy and Latter Part taken Weather
Employed Gutting a Horse Story. Found One of the Horse Throats Stranded
Saw Right Whales Lower the Boats and Shaved came Onboard
Saw a Ship Sat 3 & 20 South long West
