Thursday 29th. this day strong breeze and good weather. See whales loured got one to the Larboard boat which made 55 bb took him along side and lay by him all night.

Monday 30th. these 24 hours strong breeze and very heavy sea hands employed in cutting in &.

Tuesday 31st. this day strong breeze and good weather hands employed in boiling see whales a goin to the windward finished boiling at 12 P.M.

Wednesday Nov 1st 1836. these 24 hours strong breeze and a very heavy sea at 4 P.M. see a lone whale loured but did not fasten.

Thursday 2nd. these 24 hours squally nothing in sight so ends this day.

Friday 3rd. this day strong breeze and good weather two ships in sight.

Saturday 4th. this day strong breeze and good weather two ships in sight.

Sunday 5th. these twenty four hours strong wind and good weather.

Monday 6th. these 24 hours strong winds first part squared the yards and run before the wind at eight lured to the wind.

Tuesday 7th. these twenty four hours strong winds and good weather hands employed in setting up the head rigging.

Wednesday 8th. these 24 hours strong breeze and good weather nothing more remain^{ing}.

Thursday 9th. these 24 hours strong breeze and good weather see whales but did not fasten so ends this day.

Friday 10th. these 24 hours moderate breeze and good weather all hands employed in scraping and tarring the Chanes.

Saturday 11th. this day moderate breeze and fine weather at 6 A.M. see whales loured got 8.1 to the starboard & to the larboard and to the waste boats got him along side and began to cut in at 7 P.M. began to boil &.



Sunday 12th. this day light breeze and good weather all hands employed in cutting and boiling &c.

Monday 13th. this day strong breeze and good weather all hands employed in boiling so ends this day.

Tuesday 14th. this day squally at 4 P.M. finished boiling &c.

Wednesday 15th. this day strong breeze and good weather nothing in sight.

Thursday 16th. first part of these 24 hours squally doubled reefed the top sails middle part began to break out and star down.
