Saturday 29th this day rather squally clearing. C. — Lat 3° 46' N.

Sunday 30th first part of these 24 hours rainy latter part good weather clearing. C. so ends this.

Monday May 1st 1837. this day squally with rain so goes.

Tuesday 2nd the first part of these 24 hours good weather coos Island in sight latter part squally land about 10 miles distant so ends

Wednesday 3rd this day squally with thunder and lightning at 3 P.M. lowered down the boats and towed the ship but did not get in. Lay off and on all night.

Thursday 4th these 24 hours squally at 7 A.M. came to anchor at Coos Island latter part got off a raft of water so ends this day.

Friday 5th these 24 hours squally all hands employed in getting wood and water so goes the day.

Saturday 6th this day squally hands employed in getting wood at 10 P.M. 8 A.M. the Captain Penkeford capt. res came to anchor 56 months out 2000 lbs Swashanks Fulmouth 8 months out 4000 lbs so ends.

Sunday 7th this day squally the ship drag the larboard anchor we let go the Starboard so ends

Monday 8th this day good weather hands employed in getting wood.

Tuesday 9th this day rainy hands employed in storing down wood and water latter part sailed the ship Logan and a washanks

Wednesday 10th this day strong breeze and good weather at 6 A.M. weighed anchor and stood out to sea

Thursday 11 this day strong breeze and good weather

Friday 12th these 24 hours strong breeze and fine weather nothing in sight

Saturday 13th this day strong winds and good weather. Lat 3° 21' N.

Sunday 14th this day strong breeze and good weather so ends this day. Nothing more remarkable

Monday 15th this day strong breeze and good weather so ends this day

Tuesday 16th this day strong breeze and good weather nothing more remarkable

Wednesday 17th this day light winds and good weather &c

Thursday 18th this day strong breeze and good weather at night furled the top gallant sails and hauled up the courses —
