These 24 hours began with fresh gales from the North and eastward steering by the wind with the star board tack a board at 4 P.M. more moderate at 3 P.M. wind halled to the N.W. more ship and steered S.S.E. the middle and latter part strong winds so ended this day.

July 12th

These 24 hours begins with light gales from the W steering S.S.E. at 6 P.M. wind halled to the S.W. latter part the same. first part cloudy latter part foggy and a fine rain so ended this day.

July 13th

this day begins with strong winds from the W at 4 P.M. halled up S.W. braced the yards and halled in the stud tinsails at 1 A.M. Double reefed the topsails and furled the mainsail at 7 A.M. set the mainmast and gib so ended this day.

July 14th

first part of these 24 hours light winds from the W steering S.S.E. at 10 P.M. wind halled to the S.W. braced the yards and stood on the wind at 6 A.M. Double reefed the topsails at 8 furled the main sail

latter part the same so ended this day

July 15th

first part of these 24 hours fresh gales from the W.S.W. steering S.S.E. middle part more moderate latter part very light winds from the S.S.W. Doubled the main topsail mended and bent it again at 8 P.M. shook the reef out of the main topsail at 3 A.M. shook the reef out of the fore topsails.

July 16th

first part of these 24 hours begin with a very light breeze from the S.S.W. and cloudy ships course S.S.E. at 4 P.M. braced the yards at 6 P.M. moderate breeze from the S.S.W. at 11 P.M. strong winds reefed the mizen topsail at 1 A.M. Double reefed the fore and main topsails at 7 A.M. wind halled S.W. at 8 A.M. shook the reef out of the topsails and set the main top gallant sail.

July 17th

these 24 hours strong winds from the W steering S.S.E. first part cloudy middle and latter part foggy at 7 A.M. got the boat on the crane so ended this day.

At 9 A.M. took a lunar observation and found we were in Long 35° 47' W
