

Journal of a Voyage On Board the Ship

Sunday Dec 23 rd	First part of this day fresh breeze and fine weather wind from the Eastward steering by the wind with the larboard tack a board middle part steering S by E. Lat part wind varying and cloudy Long by Chro 30° 58' 30" W Lat 27° 54' 28"
Monday Dec 24 th	First part of these 24 hours squally middle part rainy at 6 P.M. Double reefed the topsails at 2 A.M. took in the Jib latter part more moderate shook one reef out of the topsails wind varying from the S and E steering S. Lat by Obs 27° 52' 28"
Tuesday Dec 25 th	First part of this day fresh gales and squally with rain middle part strong gales at 4 A.M. Double reefed the topsails and furled the main sail at 6 more moderate set the main sail latter part the same Lat by Obs 25° 50' 28" Long 29° 39' 28"
Wednesday Dec 26 th	First part of these 24 hours fresh gales and squally at 5 P.M. close reefed the topsails and furled the main sail at 6 A.M. shook one reef out of the topsails and set the latter part the same. Wind from the Eastward steering S by E. Lat by Obs 23° 57' 28" Long 28° 45' 28"
Thursday Dec 27 th	All these 24 hours strong winds from the E and squally under Double reefed topsails No ends steering S by E. Lat by Obs 21° 56' 28" Long by Chro 27° 51' 30" W

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Friday Dec 28 th	All this day strong wind from the E and squally latter part more moderate shook one reef out of the topsail. Steering S by E Lat by Obs 19° 53' 28" P.M. Long by Chro 27° 05' 28"
Saturday Dec 29 th	All these 24 hours strong wind from the E and cloudy steering S by E. hand Employed in ship duty so ended. Lat by Obs 17° 41' 28" Long by Chro 26° 07' 28"
Sunday Dec 30 th	First part of these 24 hours fresh breeze and squally middle part the same at 2 P.M. Double reefed the topsails latter part more moderate. Lat by Obs 16° 02' 28" Long by Chro 25° 14' 08" W
Monday Dec 31 st	First part of these 24 hours strong wind from the E steering S by E at 6 P.M. Double reefed the topsails and furled the main sail more round stood the Northward at 12 at night wore ship and stood on the wind with the larboard tack a board turned the reefs out of the topsail and set the main topgallant sail at 6 A.M. set a brig to the wind ward steering to the South so ended Lat by Obs 14° 34' 28" Long by Chro 24° 25' 28"
Tuesday Jan 1 st 1839	All these 24 hours strong winds from the E. and fine weather steering S by E half E with all sail set Lat by Obs 12° 06' 28" Long by Chro 22° 54' 45" W
