

14 Journal of a voyage On Board the Ship 1839.

Tuesday
Feb 15th
These 24 hours strong winds from the S.W. and cloudy steering S.E. by E. at 9 P.M. furled the mizen topsail at 3 A.M. set the mizen topsail at 5 A.M. shook one reef out of the top sails and set the topgallant sails at 11 took then in so end
Lat by obs 36° 47' S
Long by chro 4° 16' E

Saturday
Feb 16th
First part of this day strong winds and cloudy at 7 P.M. Double Reefed the topsails at 6 A.M. had all sail set first part steering S.E. by E. at 8 A.M. tacked ship steering by the wind heading to the S and West with the larboard tack a board
Lat by obs 36° 46' S

Sunday
Feb 17th
First part of this day light winds from the East ward and cloudy steering by the wind with the larboard tack a board at 2 A.M. steering S.E. by E. latter part the same so end this day
Lat by obs 37° 38' S
Long by chro 9° 20' E

Monday
Feb 18th
First part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.W. and cloudy at 5 A.M. halled to the N.W. with rain steering S.E. by E. ship in sight
Lat by obs 37° 49' S
Long by Luner at 2 P.M. 9° 30' E

Tuesday
Feb 19th
All these 24 hours light gales from the N.W. with thick foggy weather steering S.E. by E. a ship in sight steering S.E. by E.
Lat 37° 56' S
Long by Luner 12° 47' E

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Wednesday
Feb 20th
First part of these 24 hours light gales from the N.W. and cloudy steering S.E. by E. at 2 P.M. Doubled Reefed the topsails at 6 A.M. set the main topgallant sail so end
Lat by obs 37° 49' S
Long by Luner 15° 45' W. E.

Thursday
Feb 21st
First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from the N.W. steering S.E. by E. at 4 close reefed the topsails and furled the mizen topsails at 6 A.M. furled the fore topsail and fore sail and lay her to under close reefed topsail and stay sails lat two part 6 more moderate
Lat by obs 38° 10' S
Long by Luner 17° 34' E.

Friday
Feb 22nd
First part of this day moderate and cloudy wind from the S.W. steering set the fore and main topsail close reefed at 5 A.M. wind halled round to the East ward at 11 furled the fore topsail and foresail so end this day

Saturday
Feb 23rd
First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from the N. and E. laying to under close reefed maintopsail and staysail middle part heavy squalls with rain at 2 A.M. furled the maintopsail latter part more moderate set the foresail
Lat by obs 38° 39' S

Sunday
Feb 24th
First part of these 24 hours a very strong breeze and cloudy steering S.E. by E. under Double Reefed Topsails at 4 A.M. more moderate at 10 shook the reefs out of the topsails latter part fresh breeze Lat by obs 38° 29' S
