Ships lying to anchor Rebecked Eims Capt Coffin 33 mo out 2600 lbs George Washington 28 months out 2400 lbs Kenophon White Oak Chariot Warren Capt Little field 5 mo out 500 oil Tulcon Capt Russell 8 Bedford 8 months out 900 lbs Right whale Several french and English whale men ships and Merchant Brigs.

Tuesday April 23rd These 24 hours fine weather employed in Breaking out and stowing in the after hatch way so ended this day.

Wednesday April 24th These 24 hours fine weather employed in cooping the provisions in the after hatch way so ended this day.

Thursday April 25th These 24 hours rainy nothing doing.

Friday April 26th These 24 hours fine weather Breaking out and cooping the provisions in the main hatch way so ended this day.

Saturday April 27th These 24 hours fine weather employed in cooping provisions first part the South Carolina Capt Bayley came to anchor 5 mo out no oil.

Sunday April 28th These 24 hours fine weather hoisted the sails to dry so ended.

Monday April 29th These 24 hours fine weather got off a raft of water so ended this day.

Tuesday April 30th These 24 hours fine weather employed in cleaning ship for painting &c. 1839

Wednesday April 1st This day good weather employed in painting ship so ended this day.

Thursday May 2nd This day fine weather employed in painting ship.

Friday May 3rd These 24 hours cloudy finished painting.

Saturday May 4th These 24 hours rainy got of a raft of water and stowed it down.

Sunday May 5th This day fine weather so ended this day.

Monday May 6th These 24 hours rainy set up the Rob stays and fore topmast stay and Bow spirit shrouds so ended this day.

Tuesday May 7th These 24 hours fine weather employed in getting off potatoes so ended this day.

Wednesday May 8th These 24 hours cloudy at 1 P.M. the South Carolina weighed anchor and stood to sea at 2 we done the same at 6 P.M. spoke the South Carolina wind from the S.W. steering N.E. at 6 P.M. Cape Breton in sight 15 miles dist so ended this day.

Thursday May 9th These 24 hours fresh breeze and cloudy wind from the S.W. steering N.E. the South Carolina in sight so ended.

Friday May 10th These 24 hours fresh breeze from the S.W. and cloudy steering N.E. in company with the South Carolina. Lat by obs 32° 48' N.
