

36 Journal of a Voyage to the Pacific Ocean

July 6th These 24 hours fresh breeze and fine
 Saturday weather, wind from the S E steering
 1839 by the wind with the starboard
 tacks a board at dark tacked ship
 at 2 A M tacked a gain so end
 Lat by Obs 3° 18' S
 Long 170° 08' W

Monday These 24 hours light wind and fine
 July 7th weather, steering by the wind with
 1839 the starboard tacks a board at 6 P M
 tacked ship, at 12 A M wore round
 heading to the S so end
 Lat by Obs 2° 08' S
 Long 171° 03' W

Tuesday All these 24 hours light breeze from
 July 8th and good weather, wind varying from
 1839 S E to S by E, steering by the
 wind with the starboard tacks
 on board at 6 A M tacked ship
 and stood to the Southward,
 Lat by Obs 2° 09' S
 Long by Chro 171° 23' W

Wednesday All these 24 hours fresh breeze and
 July 9th fine weather, wind varying from
 1839 S E to E S E, steering by the
 wind with the starboard tacks
 a board, a ship in sight to the
 windward so end this day--
 Lat by Obs 1° 28' S
 Long by Chro 171° 27' W

Thursday All these 24 hours fresh breeze
 July 10th and fine weather, steering
 1839 to the Sward a ship in
 sight to the windward at 10
 Lat 0° 11' S
 A M spoke the Barke Juno
 cidney capt Banks & no ant 150 lbs

Thursday All these 24 hours fresh breeze from
 July 11th the Eastward first part steering by the
 1839 wind with the larboard tacks
 on board at 7 P M wore round
 and stood to the S and E so
 the Barke Juno in sight so end
 Lat by Obs 0° 26' S
 Long by Chro 171° 19' W

Friday All these 24 hours fresh breeze from
 July 12th the E and cloudy, first part steering
 1839 to the S at 8 A M tacked ship and
 stood to the S at 4 P M see a
 ship 1 point off our lee at 7 spoke
 the Daniel Webster Kankakee capt
 plas ket. 6 months out no oil
 latter part she was in sight to
 the leeward so end

Saturday All these 24 hours fresh breeze and
 July 13th fine weather, first part steering
 1839 to the south, at dark wore round
 heading to the S E, her ships
 in sight at 7 A M capt of S M
 by S at 10 A M spoke the Daniel
 Webster, so end this day employed
 in setting of rigging

Sunday first part these 24 hours fresh
 July 14th breeze and fine weather, middle
 1839 and latter part the same, at 4 P M
 see a whale lowered and fastened
 to him, with the waste boat,
 and got her stove, the larboard
 boat took him along side and lay
 by him all night
