

Ship Gideon Howland from the

Thurs Jan 9th 1840 commences fine weather light winds from the N steering to the S and E all hands employed boiling out oil
Lat 4° 01' S Long 184° 42' 30" East

Fri 10th commences fine weather light winds from the N steering to the S and E at daylight finished boiling turned up 50 lbs at 4 pm changed M topsail and M topgalsail latter part fine weather
Lat 4° 04' S Long 185° 48' 30" East

Sat 11th this day fine weather light winds from N steering E S E first part repaired M topgalsail latter part struck 50 lbs of oil down between decks &
Lat 4° 14' S Long 187° 30' 30" East

Sund 12th first part fine weather strong winds from N steering E S E with fore topmast and main topgalsail standing sails out middle and latter part light winds with squalls of rain
Lat by Chron 5° 10' S Long by Chron 188° 19' East

Mon 13th first part strong winds from NE middle part calm latter part strong breeze and squally steering by the wind with 2 tacks aboard the watch employed repairing Main Top.
Lat by Chron 5° 18' S Long by Chron 189° 9' East

Tues 14th first part fine weather strong breeze from NE steering by the wind with 2 tacks aboard middle part the same latter part squally this day unbent the Foresail bent another and commenced repairing the one no number
Lat by Chron 7° 09' S Long by Chron 192° 49' East

Line to the Navigators M Baker Master

Wed 15th of Jan 1840 commences rainy weather light winds from NE steering by the wind with 2 tacks aboard middle and latter part fine weather light winds the watch employed repairing the foresail
Lat by Chron 7° 59' S Long 184° 9' 30" East

Thurs 16th fine weather light breeze from NE steering to the E this day shifted fore topsail and commenced repairing it bent Main staysail & E latter part calm so ends this day
Lat by Chron 9° 05' S Long by Chron 183° 45' East

Fri 17th this day light and variable winds with squalls of rain steering E by S the watch employed E
Lat by Chron 9° 25' South Long by Chron 186° 15' East

Sat 18th this day light and variable winds with light squalls of rain the watch employed in ordinary
Lat by Chron 9° 47' S Long by Chron 186° 41' East

Sund 19th this day light and variable winds with squalls of rain steering S E by S so ends this day
Lat by Chron 9° 46' S Long by Chron 187° 11' East

Mon 20th first and middle part light winds from SE heading SSW at 4 PM saw 2 Whales lower 4 boats & the B boat struck & killed and took them along side and stood along S by E with all sail out fine weather light breeze
Lat by Chron 10° 49' S Long by Chron 188° 24' East

Tues 21st at daylight began to cut finished at 4 am and commenced boiling fine weather light winds steering S E by E so ends this day
Lat by Chron 11° 16' S Long by Chron 188° 02' East

Wed 22nd this day fine weather light winds from the westward steering S E the watch employed in ordinary duty
Lat by Chron 12° 08' S Long by Chron 182° 48' East
