light winds from ESE middle part the same
latter part hauled round to the SE steering
NNE the watch employed repairing the mainsail
Lat by Chron 15° 52' S Long by Chron 160° 52' W

Tues 7th part middle & latter part fine weather light
winds from NE steering NNE the watch
employed repairing the mainsail at 5 pm bent it
Lat by Chron 12° 44' S Long by Chron 153° 8' W

Weds 8th fine weather strong breeze from the E
steering ESE this day shifted gill & main
topsail so ends this day
Lat 11° 3' S Long 154° 32' W

Thurs 9th this day fine weather strong breeze from
the Eastward steering ESE the watch
employed in ordinary duty
Lat by Chron 8° 57' S Long by Chron 156° 34' W

Fri 10th commences really with rain wind from NE
heading SE West middle & latter part
fine weather strong breeze from NE
heading NE the watch employed in ordinary duty
Lat by Chron 7° 25' S Long

Sat 11th fine weather strong breeze from NE
steering NE the watch employed in ordinary duty
Lat 6° 18' S Long 158° 02' W

Sund 12th commences fine weather light winds from
the Eastward steering NNE middle
& latter part calm
Lat by Chron 4° 52' S Long 159° 41' W

Mon 13th fine weather & calm middle part the same
latter part light breeze from the West steering NNE
the watch employed scraping & varnishing the waste
Lat by Chron 4° 48' S Long by Chron 159° 48' W

Tues 14th of April 1840 commences fine weather
light winds from the N steering to the N Westward
the watch employed repairing fore topsail
Lat by Chron 15° 15' S Long by Chron 160° 09' W

Weds 15th all this day fine weather light winds from
NNE heading NW the watch employed in ordi-
nary duty so ends this day
Lat by Chron 3° 12' S Long by Chron 161° 15' W

Thurs 16th this day fine weather light winds
from the Eastward steering ESE
the watch employed in ordinary duty
Lat 2° 08' S Long 162° 43' W

Fri 17th fine weather light winds from the
E steering ESE at 3 pm kept her off
W by N took in topmast studding sail
& sent the booms down fore & main
topgalsail & the watch employed in
ordinary duty
Lat by Chron 00° 48' S Long 163° 11' W

Sat 18th this day fine weather light breeze
from the Eastward steering SE
at 6 pm kept her off W took in topgalsail
& courses & the watch employed in ordinary duty
Lat 00° 48' S Long 165° 15' W

Sund 19th this day fine weather light winds from
the E steering SE at 6 pm kept
her off W so ends this day
Lat 00° 25' S Long 166° 17' W

Mon 20th this day fine weather light breeze from
the Eastward steering SSE at 6 pm
hauled up NNE took in topgalsails
the watch employed making frig line to graft
our block straps along and aloft
Lat 00° 25' S Long 167° 51' W
