- Mon 18th this day fine weather strong gales from E & S heading S under double reef topsails sent down fore and mizen topsails  
Lat 23° 19' N Long 149° 45' East
- Tues 19th this day fine weather light breeze from E steering S the watch employed in ordinary duty  
Lat 24° 33' N Long 149° 07' E
- Wed 20th commences fine weather light breeze from the E steering S middle and latter part the same the watch employed in ordinary duty  
Lat 25° 41' N Long 149° 39' 30" East
- Thurs 21st all this day fine weather light breeze from E & S heading S the watch employed doing nothing  
Lat 27° 11' N Long 149° 00' E
- Fri 22nd no part fine weather strong breeze from E & S heading S middle and latter part the same at sun down took in fore and mizen topsails double reef the main sail a pin back this day  
Lat 29° 00' N Long 147° 00' East
- Sat 23rd all this 24 hours fine weather light breeze from the E steering by the wind at sun down took in sail  
Lat 30° 11' N Long 146° 00' E
- Sund 24th this day fine weather light breeze from E heading S at night took in sail and lashed ship heading S E  
Lat 29° 00' N Long 149° 54' E
- Mon 25th this day fine weather light breeze from the E heading S the watch employed in  
Lat 28° 09' N Long 149° 27' E
- Tues 26th this day fine weather light breeze from S E heading S the watch employed in ordinary duty  
Lat 28° 44' N Long 148° 00' E

Ship M. Baker Master 1840

- Thurs 27th May 1840 commences light and variable winds with squalls of rain middle and latter part the same so ends this day  
Lat 29° 38' N Long 144° 13' W
- Thurs 28th commences calm unrainy middle and latter part fine weather light winds from S S steering E by E the watch employed in ordinary duty  
Lat 29° 39' N Long 144° 57' West
- Fri 29th all this day fine weather light breeze from S S steering E by E the watch employed in ordinary duty  
Lat 29° 18' N Long 143° 54' West
- Sat 30th commences fine weather strong breeze from S S steering E by E middle part light breeze steering E at 6 pm saw a large sperm whale he went down saw him no more took in sail and lay by the wind heading S S  
Lat 28° 48' N Long 141° 30' West
- Sund 1st June commences foggy light breeze from the S S middle and latter part the same saw nothing this day  
Lat 28° 50' N Long 141° 20' W
- Mon 2nd of June commences fine weather light breeze from S S steering by the wind with sticks aboard middle part the same latter part raining this day broke out the after hold found 5 heavy casks one leaked all out one 1/2 out and one 15 or 20 gallons  
Lat 27° 45' N Long 140° 11' West
- Tues 3rd commences cloudy weather light breeze from E & S middle part heavy squalls of wind and rain took in fore and mizen topsails double reef the main latter part strong gales from E & S and clear weather at 4 pm close reef the main topsails and set the main stay sail  
Lat 27° 58' N Long 140° 20' West
