Sund 29th of March fine weather light winds

Mon 30th fine weather the watch employed painting water ways mast coats &c

Tues 31st fine weather got one boat load of potatoes &c

Wed 1st April fine weather got another boat load of potatoes filled the fish traps &c

Thurs 2nd fine weather the watch employed getting off wood &c

Fri 3rd fine weather the watch employed getting off keel & masts the Trident came in from hitas 33 mos out 12.00 the Timoleon out side being off and on

Sat 4th fine weather the watch employed in ordnance duty the London Packet came over from hitas Capt Howland 14 mos out 1000 lbs

Sund 5th fine weather and so forth

Mon 6th fine weather the watch employed getting wood pumpkins &c

Tues 7th fine weather built up the try works and got ready for sea

Weds 8th squally weather all ready for sea

Thurs 9th squally weather waiting for a chance to get out

125 From the Societies towards the Line 1841

Fri 10th of April first part fine at 11 am got under weigh and proceeded to sea in company with the Trident of 12 & the barby of 13 middle and latter part squally with rain at 2 PM spoke the Lusitany of warren 14 mos out 800th 200 of it sperm bound in

Sat 11th strong breeze with heavy squalls of wind and rain since bearing to the southward but

Sund 12th strong breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind at day light

Mon 13th squally weather with winds from the N.W. working to the N

Tues 14th strong breezes with heavy squalls of rain from the N.W. steering to the N & Eastward

Weds 15th fine weather light winds from the Northward working to the Northward Sat 16 23 South long by thro 147 - 15

Thurs 16th fine weather light winds the watch employed repairing old sails

Fri 17th fine weather and calm the watch employed making a new flying jib Sat 18 10.1 long 149 36.1 East

Sund 18th fine weather and calm so ends the day Sat 19 11.1 long 150 31 West

Mon 19th fine weather light baffling winds and calm Sat 20 12.1 long
