

Star Glacier Log. Board to
Wednesday July 13th 1864

Commenced with
A light breeze from S.E. foggy weather clearing at 4 p.m.
with all sail set at 2 p.m. got A strong breeze from S.W.
with rain reefed the mainsail & took in the light sails
employed breaking out water at 3 p.m. took in staysail
& wore around heading W. in a few minutes were back
heading N.E. by E. so ends this day Lat by Obs 57.50 N.

Thursday July 14th
with A moderate gale from N.W. 24 hours commenced
N.W. 24 variable weather
Laying to under double reefed foresail & abore reefed main
& foretopmasts & staysail up N.E. by E. A large
swell on at 5 p.m. moderate. James Annet still
off duty sick. The Cooks keeping the same. Middle
part calm & ship lay later part light breeze from
S. clearing N.W. The watch variously employed so ends

Friday July 15th
Commenced
with A light breeze from the S. 24 variable weather steering
to the northward. Middle part calm & light air. Later
part light breeze from S.E. & rain later part employed
heaving the deck in the water & so ends this.

Saturday July 16th
Commenced
with A moderate breeze from S.E. & rain so the
steering at N.W. took in mainsail at 6 p.m.
increased to a gale. Close reefed the foresail &
luffed to the wind up S.E. Middle part moderate
made sail A light breeze from N.W. later part
ice in sight blowing A gale from N. by E. by the wind
on different tracks with double reefed fore & mainsail
The barometer at 29.75 so ends this day

Hudson Bay Whaling
Monday July 17th 1864

These 24 hours commenced
with A moderate gale from N.W. 24 variable weather laying
to under double reefed foresail at 4 p.m. were around 21 set
The mainsail close reefed & foretopmast staysail. barometer rising
29.75. James Annet still off duty with general. Middle part
strong breeze from N.W. later part the same by the wind
on different tracks so ends this day Lat by Obs 61.56 N. Long 57.50 W.

Tuesday July 18th
This day comes in
with strong breeze from N.W. 24 fair weather steering by the wind
up N.E. by E. under double reefed fore & mainsail & foretopmast
staysail. A few icebergs in sight. Middle part rising & moderate
breeze at 12 p.m. saw a small stream of ice were around 21 stand
off. later part working in towards the pack so ends this day
Lat 62.06 N.

Wednesday July 19th
Commenced
with light breezes from the N.W. 24 cloudy weather working
through the ice plenty of ice in sight the pack is broke up some
middle part light air from N.W. 24 pleasant working through
the ice later part the same so ends this day
Lat by Obs 61.55 N. Long 61.15 W.

Thursday July 20th
These 24 hours commenced
with light breezes from N.W. 24 pleasant weather by the wind
working through the ice the watch employed breaking out
water. Some large icebergs in sight. Middle part light breeze
later part worked through the heavy ice with brisk breeze from
N. so ends this day
Lat by Obs 61.51 N.

Friday July 21st
Light breeze from
N.W. 24 pleasant weather by the wind on different tracks. A number
of icebergs in sight & a small island. Middle part light breezes
from N.W. later part strong breeze reefed fore & mainsail
Kaslatuk island in sight bearing N.W. distance about
30 miles so ends this day
