

Stake Glacier Log. Now Laying in winter
Monday October 3rd 1874

Commenced with
light breeze from the N.W. cloudy weather until the mainsail
is cover over aft & vessel laying here the Bark Cry. Capt
Mark Axel Gille. Voke horned in St. Helen &
middle & later part light variable winds & cloudy

Tuesday Oct 4th

This day comes
in with light breeze from the S.W. variable weather
employed hauling over aft. Later part
raining & strong breeze so ends this day

Wednesday Oct 5th

Commenced with
light breeze from the S.W. & raining weather at 10
A.M. wind veered to the N.W. & increased to a gale
at 4 p.m. A heavy gale & clear thermometer at 26
degrees freezing without foretopmast & stagsail at 12 p.m.
the Bark Cry. Capt dragged ahead of the Starboard
bow made fast to us so ends this day

Thursday Oct 6th

This day come
in with a brisk gale from the N.W. & pleasant
weather getting hot fast the thermometer at 19
later part more moderate so ends this day

Friday Oct 7th

Commenced with a
strong breeze from the N.W. & variable weather at
12 A.M. light snow thermometer at 13 degrees
later part strong breeze & snow so ends

Saturday Oct 8th

Commenced with
a moderate breeze from N.W. & variable weather here
up Starboard anchor middle part out but later part
brisk breeze from the S.E. thermometer at 19 so ends

quarters at Marble Island Remarks on Board
Sunday Oct 9th 1874

Commenced with
A light breeze from the S.E. & cloudy weather middle part
the same later part brisk breeze & snow thermometer
at 10 above zero so ends this day

Monday Oct 10th

These 24 hours
commenced with brisk breeze from the N.W. with snow-laden
three boats for the winter middle & later part strong
breeze with snow thermometer at 20 degrees so ends

Tuesday Oct 11th

Commenced with
brisk breeze from N.W. & variable weather middle part the
same later part moderate thermometer at 20 so ends this day

Wednesday Oct 12th

Commenced
with light breeze from S.W. & variable weather some ice
the Starboard anchor middle & later part light winds
& variable thermometer at 30 so ends this day

Thursday Oct 13th

This day
comes in with light breeze from the S.E. & snow squalls
got aboard two casks of water part employed ashore
building a shelter middle & later part strong breeze
thermometer at 30 so ends this day

Friday Oct 14th

Commenced with
A strong breeze from the S.E. with snow middle
& later part snow squalls thermometer at 31 so ends

Saturday Oct 15th

This day comes
in with light breeze from S. with snow squalls middle
part wind shifted to the N.W. & cleared up later
part pleasant thermometer at 32 so ends
