

John Glacier Log. Remarks on Voyage
Monday March 20th 1865

Commenced with
light breeze from N.W. pleasant weather three natives
arrived from depot island middle part pleasant
Later part light breeze from N.W. thick. Natives
are aboard & sewing. Harshins fix stockings
Thermometer at here so ends this day

Tuesday March 21st

This day comes
in with thick weather & light breeze from S.E.
middle part touch the same. A dance aboard
The Inuit. Later part snowing. Thermometer
10 degrees below here

Wednesday March 22nd

Commenced with
A brisk breeze from S.E. with snow. Middle part
the same. Later part pleasant. The natives started
deer hunting. Seal broke & some back. Thermometer
at here

Thursday March 23rd

This day comes in
with light breezes from the S.E. & pleasant weather
middle part the same. Later part light air from
N.W. Thermometer 4 degrees below here

Friday March 24th

comes in with
light air from N.W. & pleasant. Middle part
the same. A dance aboard. The Inuit. Later
part pleasant got the starboard boat off
Alongside from shore. The carpenter employed
making sleds. Thermometer 12 degrees below here

Saturday March 25th

This day comes in
with light breeze from N.W. & pleasant. Three natives
arrived & the officers brought some deer meat. Middle part
pleasant. Later part the same. Thermometer 7
degrees below here so ends this day

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Sunday March 26th 1865

Commenced with
Light breeze from S.E. & pleasant weather. Middle
part brisk breeze & cloudy. Later part snow. The
young man Samuel Maldron has a slight touch
of the scurvy. Lewis Probridge about the same. His
foot is quite sore yet. Thermometer 12 degrees above
here so ends this day

Monday March 27th

comes in with a
Brisk breeze from S.W. snow at 4 p.m. cleared off
& moderate. Middle part cloudy. Later part light
snow. The natives left & two officers with them. The
cote of Mr. Blossum started to the main land & deer
hunting. Thermometer 12 degrees below here

Tuesday March 28th

This day comes
in with light air from the S.E. & pleasant. 10 natives
arrived with two sleds load of deer skins & about 100
lbs of meat. Middle part cloudy & moderately cold from
S.E. Later part light breeze & pleasant. Thermometer
15 degrees above here at 12 A.M. up to 26 above here

Wednesday March 29th

commenced with
light air from the N.W. & pleasant weather. Two natives
left for the main land. Middle part pleasant
later part light breeze from S.E. & thick. Thermometer
3 degrees above here

Thursday March 30th

comes in with
light breeze from N.E. & pleasant weather. The
hunters got back & a few deer got none. Middle
part pleasant. Later part light breeze from N.W.
The natives all left. Thermometer at here
