

St. Lawrence Glacier Log, Wintering at
Sunday May 28th 1865

Commenced with
moderate breeze from N.W. & pleasant weather
middle & later part the same very little
clear water to be seen

Monday May 29th
comes in with

A light breeze from S.E. & cloudy weather middle
part increased to a gale with hail & rain at
9 A.M. A heavy squall attended with thunder &
lightning & hail ending with a gale

Tuesday May 30th

commenced with
A gale from S.E. rain & hail middle part
light breeze later part a gale from N.W.
& pleasant

Wednesday May 31st

comes in with
A brisk gale from the N. & pleasant weather
middle & later part the same seen one
whale going to the N.E. quick

Thursday June 1st

commenced with a
moderate gale from the N. & pleasant weather
the largest open water to the N. their has been
yet middle & later part pleasant all the boats
off cruising so ends this day

Friday June 2nd

comes in with
Light breeze from N.W. & overcast sky middle &
later part cloudy

Saturday June 3rd

these 24 hours
Light breezes from N.E. & cloudy weather
the pack in shore

Marble Island Harbor

Sunday June 4th 1865

this day comes in with
strong breeze from N.W. & pleasant weather middle
& later part light breeze the pack 8 miles off shore
all the boats off see one whale the larboard boat from
the back and gibbs fastened & saved him a small
one so ends this day

Monday June 5th

commenced with strong
breeze from S.W. & S. & changeable weather all the boats
sailing abreast of the harbor arrived at the floe at
8 P.M. & commenced cutting firshut at 1 A.M.
later part strong breeze from N.W. & pleasant
the boats off see nothing

Tuesday June 6th

these 24 hours come
with strong breezes from N.W. & pleasant weather
middle & later part light breeze the boats off
see one whale

Wednesday June 7th

commenced
with strong breezes from the N. & cloudy weather
at 4 P.M. the boats all in middle & later part
light variable winds the boats off

Thursday June 8th

this day comes in
with light variable winds & cloudy weather the
boats in see a few whales going to the N. middle
& later part strong breeze from N.W. at 12 A.M.
blowing a gale the pack out of sight

Friday June 9th

these 24 hours
A gale from the N.W. & cloudy weather the pack
out of sight
