

Schooner Glacier Log. Cruising
Remarks on Board Tuesday October 3rd 1865

Commenced with
pleasant weather & light breeze from S.E. steering
different courses to the westward finished hauling
Boat at 6 p.m. Shortened sail. Middle part
Strong breeze & squally. Double reefed foresail
Later part the same. Laying to with double
reefed foresail & close reefed mainsail up S.E. W.

Lat 40° 54' N.

Wednesday Oct 4th

This day comes in with
moderate gale from S.E. & passing rain squalls
steering N.W. with double reefed foresail &
jib set at 6 p.m. Tipped to the wind
took in jib & set mainsail close reefed
Middle part wind hauled to S.W. with
rain. Later part more moderate set fore
stay sail. Employed working off inside so ends

Thursday Oct 5th

Commenced with
A strong breeze from S.W. & rainy weather
by the wind up N.W. under easy sail at
6 p.m. increased to a gale took in jib &
fore stay sail. Later close reefed mainsail
& double reefed foresail. Middle & later
part light breeze & pleasant. A large swell
on so ends this day Lat 41° 42' N.

Friday Oct 6th

This day comes in
with light breeze from S.W. & pleasant weather
by the wind on different tacks under easy sail
employed hauling & stowing. Main rig in one
sail in sight to the S. Middle part strong
breeze with rain squally at 8 p.m.
wind hauled to S.W. & increased
to a gale took in the jib at 10
A.M. moderated so ends this day

in North Atlantic Ocean

Remarks on Board Saturday October 7th 1865

Commenced with
calm & changeable weather with a large swell
from S.W. took in foresail & mainsail on
account of slaking. Middle part gale
Later part strong breeze at 7 p.m.
raised 3 sperm whales & lowered three
Boats in chase so ends this day

Sunday Oct 8th

Commenced with
A strong breeze from the N. & raised
weather three boats down chasing whales
& mullones. A large swell on at 6 p.m.
some aboard without success & shortened
sail. Middle part calm later part light breeze
from S.W. & pleasant. Made all sail. exchanged signals with
A English ship bound west so ends this day

Lat 41° 00' N. Long 49° 54' E. by the

Monday Oct 9th

These 24 hours commenced
with light breeze from Westward & pleasant weather
steering by the wind on different tacks. A large swell from
the N. Middle part light & variable winds & passing
rain squalls. Later part light breeze from S.E. &
rainy at 8 p.m. by 6. at 11 p.m. raised 3 sperm
whales close to going quick to eastward so ends this
day

Tuesday Oct 10th

comes in with brisk
breeze from S.E. & changeable weather. Lowered three boats
for whales going quick & on some aboard at 4 p.m.
lowered & hauled up. Boat fastened & got
two small whales. Took them along side at 10 p.m. &
set the watch at daylight commenced outing & finished
at 10 A.M. raised netter with passing rain squally
