

Schooner Alucier Log. Cruising in
Remarks on Board Wednesday Oct 11th 1845

This day comes in with
brisk breeze from S.W. & changeable weather by the
wind heading N.W. under easy sail employed
cutting up blubber & other jobs. Middle & Lower part
Strong breeze & rain squally. Close reefed mainsail
Thursday Oct 12th

Commenced with
Strong breeze from N.W. with passing rain. By the
wind up N.W. & Mr. Wilson off duty sick. Two sails in
height so the west finished cutting up the heads. Middle
part heavy squalls & rain from N. with thunder &
lightning. Later part light gale from N.W. & clear
Large swell on so ends this day. Lat 40.40.1.50.44. E.
Friday Oct 13th

This day commenced
with a moderate gale from N.W. & clear weather
by the wind up N.W. & under easy sail at 3 p.m.
Increased a large swell on. Lawrence Welch off duty
sick. Middle part strong breeze from S.W. &
Squally. Later part a fresh
gale from the N. with heavy squalls accompanied
with thunder & lightning & rain. Laying to under
close reefed foresail & balance reefed mainsail so ends
Saturday Oct 14th

Comes in with a
fresh gale from N.W. & weather laying to heading
N.W. & Mr. Wilson on duty at 6 p.m. Moderate
Barometer 29.5 Middle part squally & strong
breeze were around heading N.W. & set
the jib & fore & staysail. A large swell
on. Later part the same commenced boiling
so ends this day.

North Atlantic Ocean
Remarks on Board Sunday October 15th 1845

Commenced with a
brisk breeze from N.W. & squally weather. Laying
by the wind under easy sail heading S.W. & N.W.
at 7 p.m. finished boiling the boiler & cooled
down for the night. Middle part light breeze & rain
squalls. Later part light air & calm employed boiling
till so ends this day.

Monday Oct 16th
This day comes in
with light air from the S. & cloudy weather. Three boats
down. Blackfishing got a small one finished
Boiling heads at 6 p.m. Made sail & kept off N.W.
A. Lawrence Welch still off duty sick. Middle & later
part a gale from S.W. with a large swell. North Reefed
Foresail & close reefed the mainsail passed a ship
steering to the Westward so ends this day.

Tuesday Oct 17th
Commenced with
a moderate gale from N.W. & cloudy weather. Laying
N.W. & with double reefed Foresail & close reefed
main fore & staysail & jib set. Middle part wind
passed to the Westward with heavy squalls. Later part a brisk
gale from N.W. squally heading N.W. Lat 40.45.1.
Wednesday Oct 18th

These 24 hours com-
menced with a fresh gale from N.W. & squally weather
heading N.W. & with close reefed mainsail &
double reefed foresail & foresailsail set at 6 p.m.
were around. Middle & later part squally from
the N.W. heading N.W. & so ends this day.
