

Schooner Glacier Log. Wintering

Tuesday May 16th 1865

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. pleasant weather. M. Paul off duty sick yet. Middle part fresh gale. Later part the same. Three boats crews from the ship arrived went down to the N.E. to live & look out for whales. Thermometer 10 above zero.

Wednesday May 17th

This day comes in with a fresh gale from N.W. & changeable weather getting ready to live on the N.E. end of the island. Later part moved three boats across to N.E. end so whale it so ends.

Thursday June 18th

Light breezes from N.W. & pleasant weather. Later part a fresh gale from S.E. with snow so ends.

Friday May 19th

A fresh gale from S.E. attended with snow. Middle part moderate. Later brisk breeze from N. & cloudy weather.

Saturday May 20th

A brisk breeze from the N. & pleasant weather. The pack four miles off the south side & on one the north side of the island. Middle part later part pleasant.

Sunday May 21st

Commenced with light breeze from the N. & pleasant weather. The pack in middle part the same. Later part clear water along shore. Two boats went to the ship for stores so ends.

at Marble Island Harbor

Monday May 22nd 1865

commenced in with light breezes from the N. & cloudy weather very little clear water to be seen. Middle part later part pleasant.

Tuesday May 23rd

brisk breeze from the N. & pleasant weather. Clear water along shore on the south side. Lewis growth bridge & M. Paul on duty & living on the island all the vessels. Hoisted & balling. Middle part later part pleasant.

Wednesday May 24th

commenced with fresh breeze from the N. & pleasant weather. Middle part later part light breeze & pleasant.

Thursday May 25th

This day comes in with light variable winds & changeable weather. The pack in shore. Middle part later cloudy.

Friday May 26th

commenced with light breeze from N.E. & changeable weather. Middle part raining. Later part thick fog. The pack in.

Saturday May 27th

This day comes in with light breezes from N.E. & foggy & rather at 2 p.m. seen whales off the N.E. end of ice in the first whales the season all the boats out & a strip of water along shore at 5 A.M. seen three whales in the ice so the N. at the boat so she was sent looking for whales see none. Light breezes from N.W. & pleasant so ends.
