

Schooner Alucier Log. Logging in

Thursday June 22nd 1885

Commences with

light breeze from the N.W. & cloudy weather. The Bow Boat got the schooner Alucier got a small whale & lost his line by the ice arrived at the place at 2 p.m. & made fast, one boat crew sawing ice

Friday June 23rd

Commences with

A brisk breeze from the N.W. & cloudy weather finished sawing ice in the outer harbor. Middle part later part strong breeze from N. sawing out the inner harbor so early

Saturday June 24th

Breeze in with light

breeze from N.W. pleasant weather. The Bow Boat from the Bark A. Gibbs fastened to a whale & lost a line in the ice. She 5 miles off shore to the N. Middle part pleasant. Later part a gale from S.W. The Bow Boat fastened to a whale & drew a few whales in on the leeward side

Sunday June 25th

Light breezes from N.W.

is pleasant weather. The Bow Boat from Bark Wigg fast fastened to a large whale & got foul line & was surprised another boat fastened & was surprised in a short time again succeeded in killing at 2 p.m. fresh breeze & boats commenced sawing for the island & at 5 A.M. increased to a gale anchored the whale about 5 miles off to the N.W. of the island & the boats came ashore the day ending with a fresh gale from S.W. one boat laying by the whale

Winter quarters at Agassiz Island Harbor

Monday June 26th 1885

These 24 hours commences

with a strong breeze from S.W. & pleasant weather one boat laying by the whale. Middle part the same later part light breeze & variable commenced towing in spars. The island got him in at 8 A.M. & anchored close to the shore to wait for the tide

Tuesday June 27th

Light variable winds

& pleasant weather arrived at harbor at 7 p.m. & finished cutting at 9. Later part strong breeze from S.W. & cloudy all the boats crews sawing ice in the harbor so early this day

Wednesday June 28th

Light breeze from S.W.

cloudy weather employed sawing ice. Middle part light later part strong breeze two vessels clear of ice

Thursday June 29th

Light breezes from the S.

is cloudy weather finished sawing ice & hauled out ready for sea. Middle part light breezes from N.W. later part light breezes from westward all the vessels got out & starting for the N.E. end of the island sent the boat ahead to look for whales & the harbor boat fastened to one & saved him from Bark Ariel Gibbs saw two only the pack in sight off shore. The vessel have taken 9 whales together & our share is about 100 lbs so ends this day & fine whaling

Friday June 30th

Commences with fresh

breeze from N.W. & pleasant weather two boats in shore looking for whales. See above Middle part a strong breeze laying off the end of the island. Later part a gale with snow & rain & reefed fore & mainsail so ends this day
