

Schooner Glacier Log, Cruising off  
Saturday July 4<sup>th</sup> 1865

commenced with light  
breeze from S.W. cloudy weather middle part light  
breeze from S.W. pleasant see one whale & chased him  
later part took aboard all the things from the N.E. end  
of the island the pack about 15 miles off shore so ends  
Sunday July 5<sup>th</sup>

This day comes in  
with a light breeze from S.W. fine weather cruising off  
the end of the island middle part the same later  
part calm so ends this day

Monday July 6<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours  
commenced with light breezes from the Westward  
& pleasant weather working to the N. along the  
bay in company with bark crew Capt. Ansel  
Lilly & John Cornelius the pack in sight off  
shore middle part light breeze from N. later  
part the same

Tuesday July 7<sup>th</sup>  
This day comes  
in with light variable winds & pleasant weather  
all the sails out of sight to the N. working back  
to Marble Island again caught two walrus middle  
part light air & calm later part light breeze  
from S.W. cloudy weather with passing rain  
& squalls so ends this day

Wednesday July 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with  
light variable winds & changeable weather cruising  
off the N.E. end of Marble Island some strips of  
ice around middle part the same later part light  
breeze from S.W. steering to the N. employed stowing  
down oil so ends this day

Marble Island Hudson Bay  
Thursday July 6<sup>th</sup> 1865

commenced with  
A light breeze from the S.W. pleasant weather steering  
to the N. along the land plenty of open water Marble  
Island out of sight middle part light breeze & pleasant  
at 3 P.M. off depot island the ships probe in net five about  
three miles from the land some drift ice in sight so ends  
Friday July 7<sup>th</sup>

This day comes  
in with a fresh breeze from S.W. cloudy weather steering  
along the land to the N. one sail in sight four boats  
were ashore at cape fullerton from the depot island  
masses middle part rain & sails in sight two cutting  
lowered for a whale set him only once land distance  
about 5 miles laying aback with reefed fore & main sail  
plenty of ice off shore to the N. later part light  
breeze & foggy two boats chasing whale let go the  
anchor in 17 fathoms of water so ends

Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commenced with  
light variable winds & foggy weather at 6 p.m. the  
fog light up & opened two boats for a whale going  
quick to the N. hove up anchor & stood along shore  
to the S. four sails in sight one cutting & one hauling  
middle part light air & calm one boat chasing  
whales later part light breeze from S. two boats inshore  
looking for whales set none so ends this day

Sunday July 9<sup>th</sup>  
This day comes in  
with light breeze from S.W. pleasant weather steering  
to the N. up the Kolovine at 7 p.m. off wager river  
& up to the ice, luffed to the wind & working back  
middle part light breeze & pleasant later part  
light breeze from N. two boats inshore looking  
for whales the barboard & waist went for  
Huber off duty sick
