

Schr Glacier Log. Cruising in
Monday July 10. 1865

This day comes in with light breeze from N. & cloudy weather see whale from the schooner & lowered the bow boat & succeeded in fastening by manual labour the boat to the stern of the schooner & secured the whale. commenced cutting at 4 p.m. & finished at 9. Three sails in sight very little ice in sight. Middle part clearing up decks. Later part working to the S. along the limit. Mr. Haber on duty again so ends

Tuesday July 11th

Commenced with light breeze from the N. & pleasant weather commenced boiling at 4 p.m. lowered the waist boat for a small whale & after getting him spoke about five. Middle part pleasant later part the same plenty of ice along the land. at 9. A.M. lowered for a whale in company with bark ory. Capt. J. they fastened & secured the whale. at 10 A.M. lowered for another & chased him in the ice so ends

Wednesday July 12th

This day comes in with pleasant weather & calm all the boat chasing a whale amongst the ice at 6 a.m. come aboard without success. Middle part light breeze from the S.W. working to the N. employed boiling. Later part light breeze from N. & pleasant. Spoke Cape Haden. H. bound N. at 10 A.M. off Depo island the vessels were in sight. finished boiling so ends

Rowe Welcome Hudson Bay
Thursday July 13. 1865

Commenced with light breeze from S.W. pleasant weather working to the S. for Marble Island. The floor about 3 miles off the land. Some drift ice in sight off shore. Middle part pleasant later part the same two boats in shore looking for whales see none. Employed about stowing down the whale stowed down in the so ends this day

Friday July 14th

comes in with light variable winds & pleasant weather Marble Island in sight bearing S. Distance 20 miles working up to it. plenty of drift ice in shore. Middle part laying blank off the N.E. end of Marble island. later part light air from the S. & calm the bark ory. Capt. in sight boiling so ends this day

Saturday July 15th

Commenced with light breeze from the S. & pleasant weather steering to the N. sent up foremast & foretop sail guard & sail & set it. Henry. Whirren off duty sick. Middle part pleasant later part passed depo island the vessels all were in sight

Sunday July 16th

Light breeze from S.W. & pleasant weather steering to the N. in company with bark ory. Capt. at 7 p.m. raised a whale in drift ice & lashed boat fastened & got up side. The waist boat fastened & succeeded in killing & got him alongside & finished cutting at 2 A.M. later part a moderate gale from S.W. with thunder lighting & rain. South reefed fore & mainsail at 11 A.M. cleared up & moderated made all sail so ends this day
