Thursday March 28th 1872

The wind has been light and
varying from E to N. Weather cloudy
with light fall of snow. Cleared
the snow off deck and ships.

Friday March 29

Strong gale from N & E with
snow and thick weather.

Saturday March 30th

This day we have had from N & E
to S & E with snow squalls and
cloudy - Employed hauling ice
alongside Casper at work fitting
the new boat.

Sunday March 31st

This day we have had a fresh
breeze from N with pleasant
and clear weather. The pack
ice has abated on the Island
and the bay appears filled with

Monday April 1st

Strong wind from N with thick
hazy weather. Employed making
a start for the new boat. The
Blacksmith has done some

Winter Quarters

Tuesday April 2nd 1872

This day the wind has been light
from N and cloudy with light
spots of snow. Lowered the boats
down on the ice and commenced
to fitt them.

Wednesday April 3rd

This we have had a fresh breeze
from S.E. with cloudy weather
and snow squalls. Employed
in the boats - Some of the
natives went to the main land

Thursday April 4th

To day we have had a strong
wind from E. with cloudy and
snowy weather. Employed clearing
the snow off deck.

Friday April 5th

Strong wind from N & E with
a snow storm. Some natives
came from the main land brought
about 50 lbs of fresh fish - we have
several more cases of the same.
Mr. Young has it.

Saturday April 6th

This day begins with a strong northy
wind and cloudy. Latter part light
breeze from the same quarter and pleasant.
Employed hauling ice.
