

Sunday Apr 26 1872

This day begins with a strong gale
and snow storm from N.E. Latter
part it stopped snowing and gale
moderated. Employed making a
sled in the Blubber Room.

Monday Apr 27th

This day begins with a fresh
breeze from N.E. with snow.
Latter part wind from S. and
stopped snowing. Finished the
sled and repaired the old ones
and several other jobs.

Tuesday Apr 28

There is 24 hours we have had
a light breeze from S to S.E.
with cloudy weather. The
pack is close in to the shore.

Wednesday Apr 29th

This day begins with a strong
gale and snow storm from E.
Latter part calm and pleasant.
Brought off from the shore two gullies
and royal gull, and other jobs.
Two natives came from the main
last night and brought about 100 lb
of deer meat and two that were
killed who had been hunting and
several days ago and brought about
the same quantity.

Thursday Apr 30th 1872

This day we have light and variable
winds and hazy weather. This is the
first day that the Temple has been
up to freezing point. Employed working
up to gullies and yards. Sent two men to gullies and
to M.H. mending tent and various other jobs.

Friday May 1st

This day we have had a strong gale
from N. with cloudy weather and snow
squalls. Employed making a boat tent
in the Blubber Room. The gale has
set the pack off. Got ready to start
for the S.E. end of the Island which
we propose to do if the weather permits.

Saturday May 2

Strong gale from N. 3 Boats
started for the East end of the
Island. The first chance 5 natives
came to the ship gale strong
through the day.

Sunday May 3rd

Commenced with strong gale
from N.W. More natives
came to the ship to day.
Latter part more moderate
and clear fine weather.
