

Sunday May 12th
Light and breeze and from N & E. cloudy at camp looking
for Walrus without success
Latter part snow

Monday May 13th
Strong gale from N & E and cloudy
Started work del. Breall

Tuesday May 14th
Fresh breeze from N and clear
repairing works latter part
wind S & E Pack set in

May 15th
Strong gales from S & E with
snow squalls. Weather still

Wednesday May 16th
Commenced with a strong gale
from N & E. Snow drifting heavy
at the camp we had to unhang
the door of our hut and dig out
through the snow. The men had
to come out through the roof

Friday May 17th
Fresh gale from N & E with clear
weather. The pack to sail from
here at the present and 3 men
from the Harbor - one also
freezing

Saturday May 18th
Strong gale from N & E 3 men
came to ship for coal and bread
on his return to be got a walrus
and down to ship

Sunday May 19th
Clear with strong gale from
E and cloudy - At camp out
of fuel Mr. Barry and some men
went across the Island and picked up
some that was left by other parties.
3 men returned to camp with
his crew reports that he started and
had to haul in and leave his best and
provisions

Monday May 20th
Moderate breeze from N & E and
overcast. The snow stood 47 today for
the first time - At camp the
pack off a little 2 and 3 men
started to get the stor boat and
provisions -

Tuesday May 21st
Clear with moderate breeze from
N & E. Moderate and little part fresh
breeze. At camp the coats off over-
-ing when all hands were taken
violently sick with venting and
headache & from eating Walrus
liver. Left got off in Feb. 1880
