

Wed June 19th 1872

Calm with baffling ice and cloudy
Chase a small calf off the Harbor Pack
2 mls off latter part strong breeze from
N.W.

Thurs June 20th

Calm with a strong breeze from N.W.
and cloudy. At Camp went off for a
small whale at 4 AM chase until
5 P.M. Star boat struck get him and
haul for the ship against a strong breeze
and lead tide

Frid June 21st

Strong breeze and fine weather from
N.W. Boats brought a small whale to
the ship hauled it on the ice and cut
off the blubber. 3 boats were returned
to camp

Saturday June 22nd

Calm with strong wind from N.W.
and cloudy with snow squalls, latter
part more moderate with rain.

Sunday June 23rd

Calm with strong breeze from N.W.
Latter part calm. Bailed out 10 bbls
of oil - at camp for boat to ship
with 3 men boat in tow got coal and
return to camp whale absent the other
boats chase a whale off the point

Monday June 24th

Calm with a ^{light} strong breeze at S.W. and good
weather stowed down 20 bbls oil. latter
part strong breeze from S. At camp 4 boats
in pursuit of a large whale
got near him twice being calm at the time
could not strike 3 men and crew
went to the ship with their baggage

Tuesday June 25th

Calm with fresh breeze and cloudy
from S. Marked off cut side and put
salt around the ship so the ice will
let go the the ship. latter part falling
rigger latter part rain

Wed June 26th

Calm with strong breeze from S.
started to saw the cut broke the saw
and put taring the rigger ship not
thawed around yet latter part rain

Thurs June 27th

Strong wind from N.W. with fine weather
employed sawing out. P.M. the
other two boats came to the ship
having seen nothing since
the 3rd man left
