

Wednesday July 24th 1892

Come - with light air from N - and pleasant weather - Middle part fresh breeze from the same quarter. Latter part light breeze and pleasant. Ship beating up River Welcome under all sail. Land in sight on both sides. Lat 65-05 N. Long 86-11 W.

Thursday July 25th

Come - with light air and calm from N. Middle part the same. 4 P.M. got a light breeze from S.W. Steering up the Welcome Beachy Point and Van Storker Island in sight. At 4 P.M. encountered ice so close we could not pass hauled up on the ice. Lat 66-06 N. Long 85-58 W.

Friday Wednesday July 26th

Come - with moderate breeze from N.W. with rain squalls. Middle and Latter part steady breeze and pleasant from N.W. Ship running down the Welcome before the wind - Employed repairing rigging and scraping masts.

Frank off duty with a Sam. Leg he is attended by Dr. Gay - Stevedores

Saturday July 27

Come - with light N.W. and pleasant. Steering to S.W. at 8 A.M. The boats went on shore for a small raft of water. The water got in the spring being unfit for use. Middle and latter part calm - 10 P.M. Boats were out with the water. David - off duty with a Sam. on his finger. Carpenter and Peter - S. have the sewing.

Sunday July 28th

Come - with calm and pleasant. 3 A.M. got a breeze from S.S.W. Steered towards the Welcome - Dictator and weather the same. Ship off Wager River steering up the Welcome. Latter part light air at S.W. with passing clouds. Lat 65-52 N.

Monday July 29th

First part calm and pleasant. Middle part light air from N.W. Latter part light air and calm from N.W. Ship off the mouth of Wager River. Lat 65-26 N.

Tuesday July 30th

First part light variable winds and calm. pleasant weather. Middle and latter part light breezes from S. and pleasant. Steering up the Welcome - At 4 P.M. heading in Repulse Bay - Beachy Point. Arrived at 8 P.M. anchored in Repulse Bay.
