

Repulse Bay
Monday Sept 2nd 1872

Calm and cloudy. Middle
and latter parts fresh breeze from
S to S E - with passing clouds.
Still blocked in with ice no
water in sight.

Tuesday Sept 3rd

This day with the wind has been light
from S E to N E - no change in the ice.

Wed. Sept. 4th

Fresh breeze from S to S E with
thick fog and rain. The ice remains
the same. Baled up six lbs of
water from the ice alongside.
3 men gone deer hunting.

Thursday Sept. 5th

Calm, with a fresh breeze from E
with heavy rain & P M wind
hauling to W. and sea running.
No water in sight.

Friday Sept 6th

Calm, with a fresh gale from
N - with rain. Middle and
latter parts strong gale from N W
and cloudy. The ice has started
out of the Bay and Harbor - and today
is the first time the Bark has been on
deep water since the 13th of Aug and the
first time we could cover a boat
since the 15th Aug.

Saturday Sept. 7th 1872

Calm, with a strong wind from
N W and clear weather. Middle part
the same. Latter moderate breeze
from N W and pleasant. Boats went
off cruising this morning - returned
at 4 P M saw no whales. The pack
has set off shore about 7 miles.
3 men returned from deer hunting.

Sunday Sept. 8th

Calm with a moderate breeze
from S. and cloudy. Middle
and latter parts fresh breeze from
S E, with fog and cloudy weather.
The Boats went off cruising. Saw no
whales, encountered much open ice
which cut the boats badly.

Monday Sept 9th

Calm, with a fresh breeze from
S E - and cloudy - ice coming on
fast. Boats went off this morning
found only a little water under the lee
of the Islands - Middle part thick
weather with rain. Boats returned
to ship. Latter wind S E with
rain. Bay full of ice.

Tuesday Sept 10th

Calm with a light breeze from S E
with thick fog. Middle part calm
and cloudy. Latter the same.
The Bay full of ice - no water in
sight.
