

Sunday Oct 6th 1872
Comes with a fresh breeze from
S.E. with snow. Middle part
and from S.W. still snowing.
Latter part light breeze from N.W.
and cloudy

Monday Oct 7th
Comes with a fresh breeze from N.E.
and cloudy. Middle and latter part
fresh breeze from N. with snow
squalls - Spitz-ice making fast
Therm 15 below zero.

Tuesday Oct 8th
This day we have had a strong gale
from N.W. with passing snow
squalls - young ice making fast
Therm 14 above zero.

Wednesday Oct 9th
All these 24 hours we have had a strong
gale from N.W. with passing snow
squalls - Therm 14 above

Thursday Oct 10th
This day we have had a fresh
gale from N.W. with passing squalls
and clear weather.
Therm 12 above

Friday Oct 11th 1872
The gale continues strong from N.W.
with clear weather - a part of the Harbor
on the lee side is frozen over.

Saturday Oct 12th
Comes with a fresh gale from N.W.
Middle part the same with clear
weather. Sent down main rigging
and stowed up the running rigging.
Latter part moderate and clear.
The Harbor nearly frozen over - have
the ship ahead.

Sunday Oct 13th
Comes calm and clear weather.
Middle and latter parts light
airs from N. - and pleasant.
The Harbor and inside Bay is
frozen over - some natives came
from the main land to the Islands
on the ice.

Monday Oct 14th
This day we have had a fresh
breeze from N.E. and cloudy.
Employed starting the water from
the Hotel. Albert and his
family natives arrived to the ship.
