

Refuge Bay

Saturday Oct 26

10-A. Comes- with light air from N. and pleasant. Wind and latter part calm and pleasant. Employed making a sled.

Sunday Oct 27th

4-A. Comes- with a light breeze from S. and pleasant weather. Latter part strong breeze from the same quarter. Capt went inland with about the natives.

Monday Oct 28th

20-A. Comes- with breeze from S.W. with a light fall of snow. Wind and latter part blowing a heavy gale from W. Ship laying sick to the. The fore of which broke her out out Port side.

Tuesday Wednesday 29th

20-A. The gale continues strong from W. with squalls. Hauled off a load of ice.

Wednesday Oct 30th

6-A. First strong wind from W. and clear weather. Employed laying ice steps on gangway. Salt water ice is 14 inches thick. Latter part moderate from W. and pleasant.

Thursday Oct 31st

10-B. These 24 hours we have had light air from N. with pleasant weather. Capt returned to ship with four natives and about 400 lbs of Deer meat - another team arrived with five natives.

Friday Nov 1st

4-B. Comes- with light air from N. and pleasant weather. Latter part calm and pleasant. The natives and one of our boatsteers went to their huts - one native returned with the sled.

Saturday Nov 2nd

6-B. This day we have had light air from W. and calm pleasant weather. Hauled off a load of ice. Mr William Young and David went to the native huts with the dog sled. Spencer returned on board.

Sunday Nov 3rd

6-A. Light air from W. and S.W. with cloudy hazy weather. Jim and Barry started for the natives huts with a native guide.
