

Repuise Bay May 1843

Thursday May 15th

40-A Strong gale with snow from E
Latter wind S.W. and cloudy

Friday May 16th

46-A First light breeze from S.E. and cloudy
Middle part light air from S.W. and
fine weather. Latter part calm a fog
Repaired the mainsail and bent it
and got the boats ready for painting.

Saturday May 17th

49-A This day we have had light air
from W. with fine weather. Bent
the main royal and crossed the yard
painted the boats, got off from the
shore 25 lbs fresh water

Sunday May 18th

45-A This day has been fine with light
air from E. and S.E.

Monday May 19th

52-A This day has been calm and cloudy
Sked off 100 lbs of fresh water and
stowed it down

Tuesday May 20th

48-A This day we have had light air
from W. and pleasant weather
Latter part cloudy - Dressed the lines
and fitted the boats, repairing
sleds &c.

Winter Quarters 1843

Wednesday May 21st

42-A This day begins with a light N. breeze
and fine weather. Latter part
light air from N.W. and pleasant
Hands employed washing ship
inside and out

Thursday May 22nd

This day we have had a strong breeze
from W. First part cloudy
Latter part clear weather - scraped
and washed a small head of Bone
and put up some provisions for the
Boats - Quantity of Bread from a cask of
324 Gallons

Friday May 23rd

31-A This day we have had a strong
wind from N.W. clear with
purring clouds - Got off two cask
of water

Saturday May 24th

28-A This we have had a strong gale
from N.W. with clear weather
Employed painting chains and
hauling the bare spots

Sunday May 25th

29-A Light breeze from N.W. and
clear weather - The natives returned
from work of hunting today they
not so any
