

The floor very rotten and many cracks inside
of parcel of the wind hauled it so we should
go out with the pack. Commenced to move our
provisions and Boats in shore - work from 6 AM
until 11 PM when we landed on a small
Island 5 mls from the main land - did move
over the 3 mls - made 6 trips to move boats and provisions.
Here we remained until June 14th when the pack
set off struck camp and started again down
the welcome - weather calm and pleasant. Pull
until 10-30 PM when we were stopped again by
the pack. Hauled out on the floor and camped.
June 15th went on shore over the ice saw
from the hills a large pack South of joining
on the floor as far as we could see - 6 PM
Launched the Boats and moved two mls S
to a small floor and commenced moving
boats and provisions in shore weather threatening.
June 16th Employed moving boats and provisions
in shore strong breeze from SE and cloudy.
3 AM reached a rocky point and camped
4 or 5 mls South of Mager River - Little
bit rain get a deer no water in sight.
Here we some party had camped before found the
of a Transit Instrument. Market several lbs and
some wood. - June 24 heard a whale off shore
went off over the ice found him in the pack
no chance to get at him - Remained here until
the 28 having much S.E. wind with rain
and snow - Struck camp and started down
the welcome. Saw a whale landed our provisions
and baggage on ice and chased him. 2nd mate
went on and buried him with both axes
and bomb - a good chance.

6 PM wind South and cloudy. Landed on a
point 10 mls South of where we started and camped.
Whale Point is in sight 15 mls South of us.
From 28 of June to July 4th we had a continual
N.E. gale with much snow hail and rain.
July 4th Launched the Boats and proceeded South
landed on the North side of Whale Point 5 mls
from the Point Henry Pack to Southward.
No prospect of seeing ship and our
provisions getting short. Shall return as
soon as practicable. July 6th Breeze freshened
breeze from S.E. took up camp and started
on our return pulled about 15 mls - blowing
a strong head gale hauled up boats and camped.
7th Started again with a head wind soon
came on so heavy with rain that we returned
to the point started from. From this time
to July 13 we pulled against a strong N.E.
wind with rain and thick fog - living on
half rations the last 4 days. On the 13 reached
B. Point in the fog and camped. July 14th
Light from S.E. and fine weather having one
sled which we left here we started for the
Ship with one boat leaving two men in charge
of the divided our last provisions the man
which was a small musket. The two men
that we left have what bread there is in two
containers kept until we return - arrived
to the at 2-30 PM - We got 10 deer and
one Bear while gone.
