

Repulse Bay Aug 1878

Monday 1st

Come - with a heavy gale from N with passing clouds. Mid. part much the same. Latter part cloudy and gale moderated a little.

Let John Muller out of iron. He says he was sorry for the abusive language he uttered and promising good behavior in future.

Tuesday 2nd

Come - with a strong wind from the and fine weather. Capt. with two native boats went to the E. Bay. Her Boat went to Looper Point to camp. Mast and Bow boats stationed 3 mi. north. Latter part weather the same.

Wednesday Aug 3rd

Come - with a light breeze from W and clear weather. 2 Mats came to ship. Latter part weather much the same.

Thursday Aug 4th

Come - with light air from E and clear weather. 2 Mats left the ship at 3 A.M. took a Box of Bread and 12 lbs of coffee. 5 P.M. Capt with the two native boats returned to ship had not seen whales. Brought about 300 lbs of Deer Meat. Latter part strong breeze from S - in clear weather.

Friday Aug 5th

Come - with a light wind from S.W. and cloudy. 5 A.M. Capt. left the ship with three native boats to go up the West Bay. 6 P.M. Her Boat returned. No whales seen yet. Latter part light air and cloudy.

Saturday Aug 6th

Come - with strong wind from N.E. 6 A.M. Her Boat left the ship with 4 days provisions. Latter part wind N and clear.

Sunday Aug 7th

This day begins with a light breeze from N.W. and fine weather. Middle part wind from W. Latter part light air from N.W.

Monday Aug 8th

Come - with light breeze from S.E. and clear weather. Mid. part wind S. Latter part S.W. 10 P.M. Capt. on 3 native boats returned from West Bay, no whales seen.

Tuesday Aug 9th

Come with a fresh S.E. wind and overcast with a light shower. Mid. wind S. Latter part wind S.E. with fog and rain. Her Boat returned to ship had seen no whales.
