

A log of the Bark Globe William Handy Master

Sunday the 6 fine weather wind light & all sail set standing a lee shore & sail in sight standing a lee shore ten hours later 11 AM
shore at 4 AM the distant head at 8 AM bore to off distant head
stowed on and off all night wind light & all night fine weather

Monday the 7 fine weather wind at 5 PM made all sail and
for the harbor at 8 PM the pilot came on board made all sail
in the harbor at 11 PM moved ship and stowed sail the
capt and crew went on shore the meat on board the mid

Tuesday the 8 fine weather hands in poling firing up whole grove
and putting on a ship at 6 AM cleared decks all hands
went on shore the meat on board night fine weather

Wednesday the 9 fine weather hands in poling firing up whole
grove at 6 AM all the whole grove shipped close deck
at hand on shore the capt on board the meat on shore

Sanford Brightman first officer. These 24 hours the weather
fair and bright Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 15.9
rendered myself on board and Mr. Cary left the vessel
At commenced to cooper a raft of casks also wet hold
P.M. sent a raft on shore and made preparations for
hoisting it on board. Also painting ship.

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 16th The weather fair and
bright all this day. The trade blowing regular. At 11 AM got
a raft of 91 barrels of water and hoisted it on board and
commenced to stow it below P.M. finished stowing the water
below and broke out the hold for and coopered a small
raft and sent it on shore. Also painting ship.

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 17th The weather fair. Trade
winds regular. At 11 AM stowed the things snug in the hold and
got off 8 barrels of beef. Also painting ship. The captain
took 36 pairs of thick shoes 8 pairs of slippers and one pair of
boots and carried them on shore. P.M. jumped ship painted
and got from the shore 3 barrels of beef and five of pork
also worked some in the rigging

Remarks on board Friday Nov 18th
These 24 hours the weather fair. The trade winds blowing regular
At 11 AM stowed the beef and pork in the lower hold repairing the
jackstays on the main and topsail yards and bent the main
topsail. P.M. bent the main course wet hold brought from the
shore 7 bags of white beans, a box one and a half barrels also six bags
sugar about one hundred pounds also 2 barrels of salmon
The number of new cases of the small pox for the week ending this day
for the island of Oahu is 24 deaths 18. This day discharged Surge. Sent
the steward

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 19th
These 24 hours the weather fair. The wind all round the compass
The 2nd officer Mr. Baxter rendered himself on board. We
got a raft of 21 barrels of water on board and stowed it below
also stowed the the meat below P.M. brought 200 gallons of molasses
from shore and stowed it below also stowed the salmon below

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 20th
These 24 hours the weather fair and bright. The captain and most of
the crew a shore. Got a barrel of potatoes
