

Barque Globe at Palcakauano

Friday July the 29th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours mild pleasant weather the wind light from the Srd latter middle light breeze from the Nrd with rain latter fine the wind light from the southward the canackers 10 in number went on shore and said they would come on board no more 3 came on board at night the rest remained on shore so ends these 24 hours

Saturday July the 30th 1854 first part of these 24 hours mild the wind light from the Northward middle cloudy weather the wind to the Northward latter clear the wind from the Northward employed in ships duty & so fourth so ends these 24 hours

Sunday July the 31st 1854 the first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather the wind to the Northward middle light breeze from the Northward latter part fine pleasant weather wind from the southward so ends these 24 hours

Monday August the 1st 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant took our 2nd anchor weather wind from the southward middle do fine the wind the same latter we took on board 2 casks of water & some small stores & fine fine pleasant weather the wind to the southward so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday August the 2nd 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the wind to the Southward middle do pleasant the wind to the southward latter middle mild pleasant weather the wind to Srd & Brd employed in ships duty shipped one man & so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday August the 3rd 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the wind to the Nrd middle cloudy weather with rain the wind very strong to the Nrd latter cloudy and thick weather ~~some recruits & shipping crew~~ some recruits & shipping crew & so ends these 24 hours

August the 4th 1854 Thursday the first part of these 24 hours cloudy weather wind light from the Srd Nrd middle do cloudy the wind to the Srd & Wrd light latter heavy thick weather with rain the wind strong to the Nrd 4 men came onboard so ends these 24 hours

Friday August the 5th 1854 first part of these 24 hours heavy thick weather with rain the wind strong to the Nrd middle do raining the wind strong Northerly latter thick & raining the wind the same about broke down on the cranes & so ends these 24 hours

Saturday August the 6th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours thick rainy weather the wind to the Nrd middle do the wind to the Nrd latter equally with rain the wind to the Srd another new man came on board we took our anchors & shifted berths respecting to go to sea so ends these 24 hours

Sunday August the 7th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine and pleasant the wind to the Srd at two p.m. we took our anchors and left the port of Palcakauano for home with 21 on board all told 2 of the crew unwell one by the name Elliot the other by the name of painter i understand that the agreement was thus that if they did not do their duty they would not receive any pay we find that one of our men on the articles is missing a native of the Sandwich islands & middle part mild light air from the Srd & Wrd heading N.W. at 12 o'clock squared in the yards steering W.S.W light breeze from the Nrd & Srd 2 o'clock braced up the yards heading to the Nrd & W light air & calms latter fine got our dunnage shil booms aloft & fitted the gill stay & light air & calms heading to the Srd & W so ends these 24 hours

Monday August the 8th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine & pleasant heading S.W. at 4 p.m. tacked ship and stood of shore fine breeze from the North west land in sight at 8 p.m. tacked ship & stood to the Srd untill we made Santa Maria at 11 p.m. tacked & stood of again heading N.W. the wind strong to Wrd middle equally at 2 o'clock
