

Barque Globe of New Bedford

we doubled reefed our main top sails close reefed fore top sail at 6 a.m. close reefed our main top sail & furled the fore top sail took in the jib & blowing strong from the Srd at 8 a.m. furled fore sail latter laying to in a gale of wind so ends 24 hours

augst the 9th Tuesday the first part of these 24 hours clear blowing heavy from the Srd & Srd at 4 p.m. furled the main top sail & turned up the starboard boat midle clear but blowing heavy from the quarter laying to under fore & main spencers & fore top mast stay sail latter the wether & wind the same we pumped a good deal of when pumping ship blowing heavy from the Srd & Srd heading S.W so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday augst the 10th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours laying two blowing heavy from the Srd & Srd midle the same latter clear but blowing strong the same course we find that we make about 75 strokes per hour still continue to pump oil while pumping ship at 12 am began to debate so ends these 24 hours the wind to the Srd & Srd heading S.W &

Thursday augst the 11th 1854 first part beginning to debat at two p.m. set closed reef main top sail at 4 p.m. saw a ship steering to the Srd the wind south E. heading S.W midle hazy at 12 p.m. began moderate fast at 2 a.m. set the fore sail & closed reef fore top sail at 3 p.m. turned one reef out of the main top sail at 6 a.m. set the jib & main sail beiled up the fore & main spencer & set the top sail at 8 am saw morphidit brig steering to the Nrd at 11 a.m. turned another reef out of the fore & main top sail & set the main top gallant sail the wind the same moderate body heading so ends these 24 hours. Lat 35, 49. N

Friday augst the 12th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours cloudy with some rain fitted an old sail over head for a hurricane house the wind about the same heading to the Srd & Srd at 10 p.m. took in main top gallant sail midle hazy & flawy the wind to the Srd & Srd heading S.W latter moderate at 6 a.m. set the main top gallant sail after breakfast took out main keel we found two casks stove & the oil leaked out owing to bad stowing so ends these 24 hours Lat 36, 02. Long 76, 22

Saturday augst the 13th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours hazy with a moderate breeze from the Srd at one p.m. tacked ship & stood to the Srd & Srd finished stowing down we put 3 casks of water from the bilber room & put in the lower hold midle part moderate the wind S.S.W heading to S.E. latter moderate at 8 a.m. wind began to hulk we then squared in the yards steering S by E at 9 a.m. set the fore top mast stiding sail & so ends these 24 hours

Sunday augst the 14th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.W steering S by E at 1 p.m. set main top gallant & stiding sail at 6 p.m. took stiding sails & furled the jib & main sail at 9 p.m. squally double reefed the top sails at 11 p.m. set the main sail midle squally & rainy latter fine at 5 a.m. turned three reefs out of the top sail & set the jib & spanker at 7 loosed the main top gallant sail in hoisting the runner block out after breakfast fitted it & set the sail wind W. steering S by E so ends these 24 hours Lat 37, 23. Long 77, 40 West

Monday augst the 15th 1854 the first part of these moderate the wind to the Nrd & Wrd at 5 p.m. took in main top gallant & stiding sail steering Sth midle moderate threatening the wind to the Sth the course the same latter good breeze from the Srd some squally with rain at 8 a.m. took in the top mast stiding sail & squared the yards at 11 a.m. set the main top gallant stiding sail at 12 set the top mast stay sail so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday the 16th of augst 1854 the first these 24 hours the wind began to hulk to the Srd at 3 p.m. beiled the yards took main top gallant stiding sail at 4 p.m. took in the fore top mast stay sail at 4 & took in the main top gallant sail strong breeze from West cloudy at 8 p.m. set the main top gallant sail light squally & steering Sth midle moderate breeze from the Srd & W course the same set the main fore top mast stiding sail latter light air & calms at 6 a.m. layed the yards square the light from the Nth rose a new set of stiding sail gear so ends these 24 hours Lat 38, 15 West

Wednesday augst 17th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours mild pleasant weather light air from the N.W. over halled the fore top sail runner & halved blocks & fitted them midle & latter mild & pleasant light air & calm course S by E. employed fitting mats for chafing gear & so ends these 24 hours Lat 43, 17. Long 78, 35 West
