Wednesday Dec the 13th 1854 the first part of these hours clear and pleasant with the wind light the S.E. stiring N.W. by N employed making spurn yarn put up to the fore sail & middle wires & with the same latter clear & calm with light airs from the S.E. st employed making spurn yarn & fitting the ring stopers & shank painters so ends these hours

Thursday Dec the 14th 1854 the first part of these hours fine pleasant with calm & light airs from the S.E. and N.W. st employed doing some jobs aloft middle with the same course N.W. st latter part light airs from the same quarter and the course the same so ends these 24 hours

Friday Dec the 15th 1854 the first part of these hours calm & light airs from the S.W. course N.W. st about the wither looked equally and bupling middle calm and cloudy wither at 2 a.m. breezed up from the S.E. st latter fine wither light breeze from the same quarter stiring N.W. st employed making spurn yarn made bunt gasket for the fore sail & saw a sail stem at 11 a.m. so ends these 24 hours

Saturday Dec the 16th 1854 the first clear and pleasant wither with a fine breeze from the S.E. st stiring N.W. st making yards arm gaskets & at 8 p.m. kept her N.W. st by N.W. st middle clear with a strong breeze from the S.E. st latter part equally before breakfast on bent the spanker and bent the storm top sail after breakfast breezed on hard commenced taking in sail at 12 we were under double reefed top sail and so ends these 24 hours

Sunday Dec the 17th 1854 the first part of these hours equally blowing strong from the S.E. st after dinner we pulled the main sail and close reefed the fore top sail at 6 p.m. commenced raining heavy and the wind died and the barometer fell for a short time at 7 p.m. we came up N.W. by W middle equally at 10 stopped raining the wind hauled round to the N.W. st heading N.W. st laying under cloud reefed top sails latter more moderate clear wither heading from N.W. st st turned one reef out the top sail, next the fidd & main sail so ends these 24 hours

Passage from Takahuan to New Bedford by David H. Baber

Monday Dec the 18th 1854 the first part clear & pleasant wither a wind light from N.W. st with a heavy swell on heading N.E. st at 3 p.m. backed ship heading west a canacher went out for land from mast head off the wither quarter i went a looft but did not see it middle clear & calm wither latter part light breeze from the S.E. st stiring W.N. W with stiding sails out employed setting up the de main rigging so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday Dec the 19th 1854 the first part of these 24 hours fine wither light breeze from the S.W. st to W stiring by the wind set up the de fore rigging after 4 p.m. broke out for water 2 1/2 p.m. made the land at 1/2 past 5 saw light on Bermuda at 7 p.m. on E. st & N.W. st distance 16 miles or there abouts middle clear with a strong breeze from the S.E. st and W.N. W

stiring N.W. st latter part came up equally took in the main top galt sail & doubled reefed the top sails took in fidd and main sail at 8 a.m. set fidd and main sail again about 12 there came up a heavy rain squall we hauled up the main sail closed down the main top sail & closed up the fore top sail took in the fidd & let them hang till after dinner the we set them again so ends these 24 hours stiring N.W. by N.W. st

Wednesday Dec the 20th 1854 the first part of these hours squally about 2 p.m. we had a heavy squall we hauled up the main sail took in the fidd & closed down the top sails when the squall passed over we set them again at sunset the wither moderated down stiring N.W. by N.W. st middle came up equally we masted took in the main top galt sail and mizen top mast stay sail at 3 o'clock i came on Deck and closed down the main top sail and double reefed it and then closed down the fore top sail and closed reefed it at 6 a.m. took in the fidd and main sail course the same latter equally wither strong wind from the S.E. st & W.N. W after breakfast reefed the main sail and set it at 10, squally hauled up the main sail at 11 the wind hauled round to the N.W. st and N.W. st heading N.W. st & N.E. st so ends these 24 hours

Thursday Dec the 21st 1854 the first part equally at 2 p.m. the wind began to blow on strong from the N.W. st commenced taking in sail close reefed the main top sail & furled the fore top sail fore sail & main sail at 3 we were ship and set the fore spencer heading west by N.W. st Capt Handy unwell at 7 flowing heavy in a squally middle squally after 12 began to moderate at 1 a.m. set the fore sail heading from west to S.W. st at 6 set fore top sail close reefed
