

Remarks on Board Bark Globe. 1858.

Sunday Sept. 17th Commences with a moderate breeze from the E. N. E. with thick hazy weather. steering South at 1 P.M. hauled by the wind to the North. Middle part the same. latter part steered N.W. all sail on

Monday Sept. 20th Commences with a light breeze from the Eastwards with thick hazy weather. steering N.W. at 6 P.M. shortened sail & hauled by the wind to the N. N. E. Middle & latter parts light breeze. at daylight made sail & steered S. S. W. at 8 A.M. saw St. Nicolas bearing South about 30 miles distant hauled by the wind to the S. E. found the Chronometer 26 miles too far west by the land

Tuesday Sept. 21st Commences with a light breeze from the N. E. with hazy weather. steering to the south. at 6 P.M. shortened sail & hauled by the wind to the North at 8 P.M. tacked to the S. E. & E. Middle part tacking off & on the S. E. Point of St. Nicolas. latter part at daylight steered in for St. Georges Bay at 8 A.M. steered S. by E. for St. Jagoes

Wednesday Sept. 22nd Commences with a fresh breeze from the N. E. with thick smoky weather. steering S. by E. at 3 P.M. saw St. Jagoes bearing S. W. by W 23 miles distant at 4 & 5 P.M. the S. E. Point bore S. W. 15 miles distant. steering South between Isle of May & St. Jagoes. Middle part at 11 P.M. hauled aback the main topsail heading to the N. E. latter part at daylight made sail & stood in for Port Prager at 11 A.M. the Captain went on shore

Thursday Sept. 23rd Commences with strong trade wind lying off & on at St. Jagoes. at 6 P.M. sent 28 Barrels of sperm oil on Board the Brig Lucy Atwood of New Bedford to take home for us. at 6 P.M. the Captain came on Board & stood off Whore C. S. E. Middle & latter parts lying off & on at St. Jagoes. Discharged John Lerby sick. the Captain paid his passage in the Lucy Atwoods. employed taking off Oranges & Bananas

Remarks towards the line 1858.
Friday Sept. 24th Commences with fresh trades at 3 P.M. the Captain came on Board with two natives of the Island to go with us. steered S. by E. all sail on. Middle & latter parts light breeze & pleasant. saw Blackfish lowered the Boats without success. one man sick

Saturday Sept. 25th Commences with a light breeze from the East with smoky weather. heading S. by E. saw a Breach & Blackfish. Middle & latter parts light breeze with passing squalls. steering S. by E. employed at ships duty one man sick

Sunday Sept. 26th Commences with light airs from the Eastwards with light squalls of rain. steering S. by E. Middle part the same. latter part light breeze & pleasant steering South. two men sick

Sat by obs 10. 27. N

Monday Sept. 27th Commences with a light breeze from the E. by S. to E. N. E. with pleasant weather. steering South. saw a Brig. saw Blackfish got one. Middle & latter parts light breeze with passing squalls. employed at ships duty two men sick.

Song by Ch. 20. 58. W

Tuesday Sept. 28th Commences with a light breeze from the N. E. with passing squalls. steering South. saw Blackfish lowered the Boats they went off to windward. at 6 P.M. a squall came up from the Eastwards with thunder & lightning. took in the light sail & double reefed the topsails. Middle part variable wind & squally. latter part moderate breeze from S. W. heading S. S. E. saw five sail. two men sick employed Boiling Blackfish
