

Remarks on Board Bark globe. 1859.

Saturday Feb. 19th Commences with a strong breeze from the South with hazy weather & rugged. heading to the W. S. W. at 5 P.M. shortened sail. Middle & latter parts wind & weather the same. at noon tacked to the S.E.

Long 60° 30'

Sunday Feb. 20th Commences with a strong breeze from the S. S. W. with hazy weather & rugged. heading S.E. saw a sail at sunset took in the mainsail. Middle & latter parts the same. saw two sail

Lat 40° 21' 25" S
Long 60° 10' 04" E

Monday Feb. 21st Commences with a strong breeze from the South with hazy weather heading to the Eastwards. spoke the Cornelia. at 10 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. Middle and latter parts strong breeze & rugged. at 8 A.M. steered N.W. saw two sail

Tuesday Feb. 22nd Commences with a strong breeze from South with hazy weather & rugged. steering N.W. to N.E. at sunset took in the main sail. Middle & latter parts the wind more moderate. steering N.N.E. saw a finback

Wednesday Feb. 23rd Commences with a moderate breeze from the South. steering N.N.E. the weather thick & hazy. Middle & latter parts strong breeze. steering N.N.E. Cooper employed setting up shooks

Thursday Feb. 24th Commences with a strong breeze from the S. S. W. with hazy weather steering N.E. at 8 P.M. shortened sail & wore ship to the Westwards. Middle part at 1 A.M. wore ship to the Eastwards. latter part moderate breeze with thick hazy weather steering N.E. at 9 A.M. heard the breakers on the shore. sounded & got 30 fathoms. steered N.W. at 11 A.M. saw the land

Remarks at Little Fish Bay 1859.

Friday Feb. 25th Commences with light breezes from West to S.W. with hazy weather. steering to the North. at 1 1/2 P.M. shortened sail & hauled by the wind to the W. N.W. sounded with one hundred fathoms line no bottom. Middle part lay aback. latter part at daylight made all sail & stood in East for the land. at 9 A.M. saw the land about 10 miles distant

Long 60° 30'

Saturday Feb. 26th Commences with a light breeze from the S.W. with hazy weather steering down the land for Little Fish Bay. at 1 1/2 P.M. came to anchor in 7 fathoms water with 30 fathoms chain. Middle & latter parts pleasant weather at 9 A.M. sent a raft of cask on shore for water. at 11 A.M. the Captain came off from the shore. When he went on shore he told the Boat's crew to stay by the Boat. but John Main & Bartholomew Newton left the Boat & went up to a house & got drunk. John Main drew a knife on a Portuguese & also threw stones at him. When he came on board the Captain put him & Newton in irons. Main whilst in irons threatened to see the Captain's heart's blood & said he should like to put a knife up to the handle in his guts. at 3 P.M. let Newton out of irons & he went to his duty. at 3 1/2 P.M. took a raft of water on board.

Sunday Feb. 27th these 24 hours light breeze & pleasant. John Main in irons

Monday Feb. 28th these 24 hours moderate breeze & pleasant. employed stowing away water & washing ship ready for painting. sent a raft of cask on shore for water Main in irons.

Tuesday March 1st these 24 hours moderate breeze & pleasant. employed taking off water. Painting & setting up rigging. Main in irons.

Wednesday March 2nd these 24 hours pleasant weather. employed painting. setting up rigging & taking on board recruits. Main in irons
