Tuesday March 22nd Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. with hazy weather. steering W. N.W. Middle & latter parts the same

Wednesday March 23rd Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. with hazy weather. steering W. N.W. Middle & latter parts wind & weather the same. employed at ship's duty

Thursday March 24th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather. steering W. N.W. Middle & latter parts wind & weather the same. employed at ship's duty

Lat 16.. 50 S.

Friday March 25th Commences with a light breeze from the S.W. with pleasant weather. steering W. N.W. at 5 & P.M. the Captain called all hands aft & read the shipping articles to them & said to them that he was going in to St. Helena to give them liberty 24 hours. spide & should send a Boat in for them at 6 o'clock in the morning for them & should expect them to come on Board at that time. if they did not come on Board at that time he should stop them. Liberty. Middle & latter parts light breeze & pleasant at 7 A.M. saw the Island of St. Helena bearing N.W. about 60 miles distant. saw two sail

Saturday March 26th Commences with a light breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather. steering for the Islands. at 8 P.M. the Island about 20 miles distant. took in the light sail & hauled by the wind to the Eastward. Middle & latter parts Moderate breeze. at 10 & A.M. came to anchor at St. Helena in 23 fathoms water with 60 fathoms Chain
