

Remarks at St. Helena 1859.

Sunday March 27th these 24 hours fresh flaws & pleasant weather

Monday March 28th these 24 hours moderate breeze and pleasant. employed Coopering Breads

Tuesday March 29th these 24 hours pleasant weather. employed tending the Bunsail. the starboards watch went on shore on liberty. sent four barrels slush on shore.

Wednesday March 30th these 24 hours strong breeze. employed getting out oil to take on shore. at 6 A.M. the starboards watch came on Board. & the Starboard watch went on liberty.

Thursday March 31st these 24 hours strong flaws from the land at 8 A.M. sent a Boat in for the liberty men. all came on Board. sent 451 gallons of sperm oil on shore. the starboard watch went on liberty. employed painting the Boats.

Friday March April 1st these 24 hours pleasant weather at 6 sent a Boat in for the liberty men. all came on Board except John Main. W^m Brown & Henry Williams they got put in Prison by the Police on shore at 7 A.M. the Starboard watch went on liberty.

Saturday April 2^d these 24 hours pleasant weather at 8 A.M. sent in a Boat for the liberty men all came on Board except Michael Shay & Ellis & John Main. Henry Williams and William Brown. they had been set at liberty from Prison. the Capt. saw them & ordered them to go on Board but they refused to go. the Capt. put them in Prison.

Sunday April 3^d these 24 hours pleasant weather and watch on liberty.

Monday April 4th employed getting ready to take water on Board. at 10 A.M. the Captain took the men out of Prison & ordered them to go on Board they refused to go they said they wanted to see the Consul. the Capt. sent them up to the Consul. he heard their complaints & sent them on Board told them to go to their duty & he would investigate their complaints. they came on Board & ordered them

to go to their duty they refused. i then put them in Irons as ordered. Presbury Jones Deserted. took 30 lbs water on Board.

Tuesday April 5th these 24 hours moderate breeze & pleasant employed at ships duty. 5 men in irons. the officers & men on Board. entered a Protest to the American Consul against John Main he being the cause of our trouble on Board.

Wednesday April 6th these 24 hours cloudy weather employed getting ready for sea. five men in irons. they refused duty.

Thursday April 7th these 24 hours pleasant weather. employed at ships duty. at 6 A.M. 8 men went on liberty.

Friday April 8th these 24 hours strong breeze & cloudy. the liberty men all came on Board. four natives of St. Helena came on Board. that the Capt. shipped. 5 men in irons.

Saturday April 9th Commences with a fresh breeze & cloudy. at 2 P.M. took John Main on shore to the Consul & Discharged him. at 4 P.M. got under way & stood to the Eastward. the Captain on shore. Middle & latter parts fresh trades & cloudy lying off & on. at 7 A.M. sent a Boat in for the Captain. the 4 men we had in irons said they would go to their duty. let them out of irons.

Sunday April 10th Commences with strong trades lying off & on. at 6 P.M. the Boat returned to the ship stood off to the Eastward under short sail. Middle and latter parts lying off & on. at 11 A.M. the Capt. came on Board we stood to the Eastward.

Monday April 11th Commences with a strong breeze & rugged. heading to the E. N.E. Middle & latter parts strong breeze & squally. heading to the Eastward.
