

Remarks at Bish Bay 1852

Thursday June 23rd these 24 hours light wind & foggy employed Coopering Oil. Finished on the larboard side

Friday June 24th these 24 hours light breeze & pleasant employed Coopering Oil finished in the Main Keel.

Saturday June 25th these 24 hours light breeze & hazy took a raft of Cask on shore for water

Sunday June 26th these 24 hours light breeze & cloudy a Portuguese Steamer sailed for Soanda

Monday June 27th these 24 hours light breeze & pleasant weather employed Coopering Oil & Blacking the Bends

Tuesday June 28th these 24 hours light breeze & pleasant employed giting off water & stowing it away. at 2 P.M. took a raft of Cask on shore for water

Wednesday June 29th these 24 hours a moderate breeze with hazy weather. employed giting off water & Potatoes

Thursday June 30th these 24 hours light breeze with hazy weather employed taking off Potatoes & Priming the Bends. one of the crew a Portuguese by the name of Manuel went on shore with the Captain. Came on Board drunk about 4 P.M. he jumped over Board. sent a Boat & brought him on Board. put him in Irons

Friday July 1st these 24 hours pleasant weather employed stowing away water

Saturday July 2nd these 24 hours pleasant weather employed at ships Duty

Sunday July 3rd these 24 hours light breeze & pleasant at 1 P.M. the Captain went on shore. William Brown. Michel Shay. Joseph Haynes W^m H. Ellis. Deserted

Monday July 4th these 24 hours light breeze from the North. the Captain went on shore after the men that Deserted. but could not hear from them

Tuesday July 5th these 24 hours light breeze & calm the Governor sent soldiers after the runaways

Wednesday July 6th these 24 hours fresh breeze all ready for sea. waiting for the Deserters. the Negroes found were Brown & W^m H. Ellis. Could not hear from the other two

Thursday July 7th Commences with a strong breeze from the W. S.W. at 1 P.M. the Captain sent the two men on Board & ordered them to be put in Irons. at 3 1/2 P.M. took the anchor & stood out to sea heading N.W. Middle & latter parts fresh breeze & hazy. at 12 midnight steered N.E. saw finbacks. employed at ships Duty

Friday July 8th Commences with a fresh breeze from the W. S.W. with hazy weather. steering North. at 4 1/2 P.M. the Captain took W^m Brown & W^m H. Ellis out of Irons & put them in the rigging & gave them a few lashes with a cat they promised to behave themselves. took them down & sent them to their Duty. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & hazy. employed at ships Duty

Saturday July 9th Commences with a moderate breeze from the W. S.W. with hazy weather. steering North Middle & latter parts moderate breeze from the S.W. saw finbacks. employed at ships Duty
Lab 9. 30. 15

Sunday July 10th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. with hazy weather. steering N. & N.E. Middle & latter parts the same
