

Remarks on Board Bark globe 1851.

Monday July 11th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. with cloudy weather steering S. of S. Middle & latter parts light breeze & cloudy. saw a Finback
Saw 4 obs 8. 08. 18.
Song of Ch. 11. 30. 8.

Tuesday July 12th Commences with a light breeze from S. of W. to W. of W. with hazy weather. steering S. of W. Middle & latter parts light variable winds. saw humpbacks & finbacks. saw a ship steering to the North.

Saw 4 obs 7. 17. 18
Song of Ch. 12. 08. 6.

Wednesday July 13th Commences with light airs from E. S. E. to N. W. heading to the N. E. at 5 P.M. bent the harbour chain & put the anchor off the bow. Middle & latter parts light variable winds. steering in for the land. saw a sail at noon saw the land. sounded fathoms 15 & 3 fathoms water
Saw 4 obs 6. 47. 18

Thursday July 14th Commences with a light breeze from the E. S. E. with hazy weather at 3 P.M. saw humpbacks lowered & chased till 6 came on board. anchored in 7 & 8 fathoms water the land about 5 miles distant. Middle & latter parts light breeze. at 8 A.M. took the anchor & steered down the shore

Saw 4 obs 6. 22. 18
Song of Ch. 12. 21. 6.

Friday July 15th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S. E. & hazy. saw the Kanawa. she had a humpback dead at 3 A.M. anchored in 8 fathoms water abreast of the Red Cliff. Middle & latter parts light breeze. at 7 A.M. lowered for humpbacks

Saturday July 16th Commences with a moderate breeze & hazy. struck & got a H. Back. got the ship under way & took him alongside. at 7 P.M. commenced cutting. at 10 finished. Middle & latter parts wind and weather the same employed cutting up blubber the boats off after humpbacks

Sunday July 17th Commences with a fresh breeze & hazy. the boats off after H. Backs. at night came on board got none. spoke the Peri of N. Bedford Middle & latter parts at daylight commenced boiling

Monday July 18th these 24 hours hazy weather employed chasing H. Backs & boiling. at 2 A.M. finished boiling

Tuesday July 19th these 24 hours moderate breeze & hazy saw six humpbacks. chased them got none

Wednesday July 20th these 24 hours light airs & calm. employed chasing H. Backs. got none. they are very shy

Thursday July 21st these 24 hours light airs with hazy weather employed chasing H. Backs got none. at 5 P.M. took our anchor & stood out in 10 & 9 fathoms water and came to anchor

Friday July 22nd these 24 hours moderate breeze & hazy. chasing H. Backs. struck one the line got foul & capsized the boat. lost a line & the whale

Saturday July 23rd these 24 hours light airs & hazy. chasing H. Backs. saw five. got none.

Sunday July 24th these 24 hours light airs & hazy. chasing H. Backs. struck one he run out to sea had to cut

Monday July 25th these 24 hours light breeze & hazy. chasing H. Backs. at 4 P.M. took the anchor & stood down the coast at 8 anchored in 7 fathoms water

Tuesday July 26th these 24 hours moderate breeze & pleasant at 8 A.M. saw H. Backs lowered the boats & struck one the Irons drewed & we lost him. took the anchor & steered for the Congo at 2 P.M. off Cape Padron. at 7 & 9 P.M. came to anchor in 12 fathoms water to the north of the Congo.
