

Remarks at St. Helena. 1860.  
Saturday March 17<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours moderate breeze & pleasant. employed fitting the main & topmast rigging. at 5 P.M. one watch went on liberty.

Sunday March 18<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours fresh breeze one watch went on liberty. at 6 A.M. all came on Board.

Monday March 19<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours passing squalls of rain. employed fitting rigging & lashing up the spare spars. at 11 P.M. Henry Williams left the Hospital & came on Board.

Tuesday March 20<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours moderate breeze. employed wooding from an old ship. waiting for the Mast. at 5 P.M. one watch went on liberty.

Wednesday March 21<sup>st</sup> these 24 hours light breeze with passing squalls. at 8 A.M. the watch came on Board. employed painting the Bends & wooding. received 8 Barrels of meat from the Keoka in place of that we let them have on the Coast of Brasil.

Thursday March 22<sup>d</sup> these 24 hours fresh flaws with passing squalls of rain. employed painting ship & getting wood. Wm. Brown & Charles Carroll were put in Prison for getting drunk & fighting on shore. they were tried & sentenced to pay a fine. the Captain paid their fine. at 10 A.M. they came on Board. at 5 P.M. one watch went on liberty.

Friday March 23<sup>d</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather at 8 A.M. the watch all came on Board & the starboard watch went on liberty. employed at ships duty. waiting for the Mast.

Saturday March 24<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather employed at ships duty. the watch all came on Board. & the other watch went on liberty. waiting for the Mast.

Sunday March 25<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather at 8 A.M. the watch all came on Board and the starboard watch went on liberty.

Monday March 26<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours fresh breeze with pleasant weather. at 8 A.M. the watch all came on Board. at 11 A.M. took our new Mast along side. at 3 P.M. started it. at 8 P.M. Bartholomew Newton had several fits. at 8 P.M. let one watch have a run on shore.

Tuesday March 27<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather at 8 A.M. the watch came on Board. employed putting on the main rigging & sent up the top mast. & set up the rigging. one watch went on liberty. Newton had several fits to day.

Wednesday March 28<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather sent up the main top gallant Mast. lower & top - sail yards & bent the sails. three men sick.

Thursday March 29<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather employed setting up rigging & rattring down. at 8 P.M. one watch went on liberty. the Captain took Bartholomew Newton to the Hospital.

Friday March 30<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours pleasant weather employed setting up rigging & rattring down. at 8 A.M. the watch all came on Board. at 8 P.M. the starboard watch went on liberty.

Saturday March 31<sup>st</sup> these 24 hours fresh breeze with passing squalls of rain. at 8 A.M. the watch all came on Board. employed getting off wood & Cask ready for water at.
