Monday April 16th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. with hazy weather. Heading to the Eastward. at 3 P.M. steered N.W. in for the Island. at 7 P.M. hauled by the wind to the Eastward took in sail & hauled back. the land about 12 miles distant. Middle & latter parts wind and weather the same at 8 A.M. stood in for the Harbor at 10 1/2 A.M. went on shore

Tuesday April 17th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. Could not finish our business with the Consul. on account of the officers & crew demanding their pay for their labor in getting in the new mast. at 3 P.M. came on board & stood off to the S.E. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze at 8 A.M. stood in for the Harbor at 10 went in with a boat. spoke the bark Galea of N.B.

Wednesday April 18th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. at 4 P.M. came on board & stood off to the Eastward. Middle & latter parts moderate breeze & pleasant at 7 A.M. backed to the south. saw a bark Boiling. at noon backed to the Eastward.

Thursday April 19th Commences with a moderate breeze spoke the bark Washington Boiling. steered to the W. S.W. at 2 1/2 P.M. saw four sperm whales going to the N.E. at 3 lowered the boats & struck & got one at 4 1/2 P.M. took him alongside & shortened sail. St. Helena Bearing S.W. by W. about 45 miles distant. saw the Roons take a whale. Middle part employed starting water & stowing away wood. latter part got up the Rables & Canning

Friday April 20th Commences with a moderate breeze from the south with some swell. at 5 P.M. had the Whales Body in. the head alongside St. Helena bone off about 40 miles distant. Middle part fresh breeze. latter part at daylight hooked on the head at 7 A.M. had it on deck. at 8 commenced on the case. at noon finished. made sail & wore ship to the S.W. & commenced Boiling. saw the Roons.

Saturday April 21st Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.E. with pleasant weather. heading to the S.W. employed Boiling. at sunset took in the light sail. Middle & latter parts light breeze & pleasant. saw a bark
