all ready for sea

Saturday May 19th Commences with Moderate breeze
at 3 P.M. all hands on board took our anchor and
stood out to the S.W. Middle & latter parts Moderate
breeze from the S.E. tacked in shore, saw a sail
Lat Obs 16. 09 S

Sunday May 20th Commences with a Moderate
breeze from the S.E. tacked off shore. spoke
the Falcon of N. Bedford. at sunset shortened sail
middle & latter parts Moderate breeze. at 2 A.M. tacked
in shore. at Noon off the South side of the Island
about 8 miles distant. saw two sail

Monday May 21st Commences with light breeze
with passing squalls. heading to the Eastward
at 3 A.M. Georges Islands about 4 miles distant tacked
off shore to the S.W. at sunset shortened sail
middle & latter parts strong breeze & squally. tacked to
the Eastward. at 10 A.M. steered off for the West End
of the island. at Noon the West Point about 5 miles
distant

Tuesday May 22nd Commences with a strong breeze
& squally with a high sea. at 1 P.M. off Egg Island
about 5 miles distant. took in the fore topsail
at 5 P.M. off James Town. heading to the Eastward
middle & latter parts strong wind & a high sea. at 3 A.M.
tacked to the South. at Noon off Helena 15 miles distant
Lat Obs 15. 39 S

Wednesday May 23rd Commences with strong breeze
from the S.E. with squally weather & very
rugged. heading to the S.W. under short sail. at
2 P.M. wore ship to the Eastward. middle & latter
parts wind & weather the same at 3 A.M. took in the
fore topsail

Thursday May 24th Commences with a strong breeze
from the S.E. with cloudy weather & a high sea
at 4 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. middle part the
same. latter part more moderate made sail heading
to the South. saw two sail

Friday May 25th Commences with a fresh breeze from
the S.E. with passing squalls. at 2 P.M. wore ship
to the Eastward. middle & latter parts fresh breeze & squally
at 2 A.M. tacked to the S.W. employed breaking out for
a fore sail. at Noon off the East side of St. Helena.

Saturday May 26th Commences with a strong breeze
from the S.E. with squally weather & rugged
at 2 P.M. tacked to the Eastward. at 4 P.M. bent a new
fore sail. middle & latter parts more moderate. tacked
twice during the night. employed at ships duty

from the S.E. at 2 P.M. tacked to the S.W. saw the
Falcon. at sunset shortened sail. middle & latter parts
Moderate breeze. at daylight made sail. saw the Rocas.

from the S.E. & Cloudy. at 1 P.M. tacked to the Eastward
spoke the Washington by Harbor & Benjamin Cumming
middle & latter parts wind & weather the same employed
at ships duty
